# YOAKUM COUNTY Commissioners' Court



Commissioners met Jan. 30 in special session, opening bids on fuel for Precinct 3. Eddins-Walcher submitted the only bid. Action will be taken on the bid Feb. 6.

Only one bid was received on a commercial dishwasher for Denver City Civic Center. The bid from Koplun Kitchens was rejected.

Terry Maynard was approved for employment in the sheriff's department as jailer, effective Feb. 1 on six month probationary period.

An amendment of a motion of Jan. 22, 1979 and amended Sept. 14, 1979 regarding spouses of retired employees covered with hospitalization was approved to read: "that for County employees who being eligible or having signed up for deferred service retirement, and who, while still working for the county, become deceased, his spouse will remain on county hospitalization insurance." The provision to be retroactive and to reimburse Charlotte Kennedy, who has been paying her own premiums.

Invoices on new hospital construction costs were read and approved for payment as was extra hire.

Commissioners voted to advertise for bids for a self-propelled broom, with a trade in of Broce broom, Hough loader and double drum static roller. Bids will be received Feb. 16 for study, with action slated Feb. 20.

Commissioners also voted to advertise for bids for five heavy duty trucks and offer three Mack trucks in trade. Bids will be opened March 6 and action taken March 13.

# Kitchen Korner

## TUNA TEASER

4 oz tuna  
2 t onion flakes  
2 t parsley  
2 t celery flakes  
Tabasco  
1 slice bread  
¼ c hot water  
Mix and form into balls; then bake at 350°.

## FLOUR TORTILLA COBBLER

Break up flour tortillas to cover bottom of dish; layer fruit next, on top of tortillas. Then break up flour tortillas on top of fruit again, depending on how deep dish is (how many layers you have). Sprinkle with cinnamon, then pour \*sugar mixture on top and cook 350° for 35 to 40 minutes.

\*Sugar Mixture: ¼ c sugar, 1 stk oleo, 1 c water - Bring to a boil then pour over prepared cobbler.

## AMISH COOKIES

1 c sugar  
1 c powdered sugar  
½ c Crisco  
1 stk oleo  
1 c Crisco oil  
2 eggs  
4½ c flour  
1 t soda  
1 t cream of tartar  
½ t salt  
1 t vanilla

Mix in order given. Roll into balls and flatten with glass. Sprinkle with sugar. Bake 10 mins. at 350°.

## CHEESE KRISPOS

2 stk margarine  
10 oz sharp cheddar cheese, grated

½ c Parmesan cheese  
1½ t salt  
1 t paprika  
½ t cayenne pepper  
2 c flour  
2 c Rice Krispies  
Mix margarine and cheese

together. Sift dry ingredients and mix into first mixture. Add Rice Krispies and mix. Roll into balls, place on greased cookie sheet and flatten with a fork. Bake at 350° 10-12 mins. Makes about 75 Cheese Krispos.

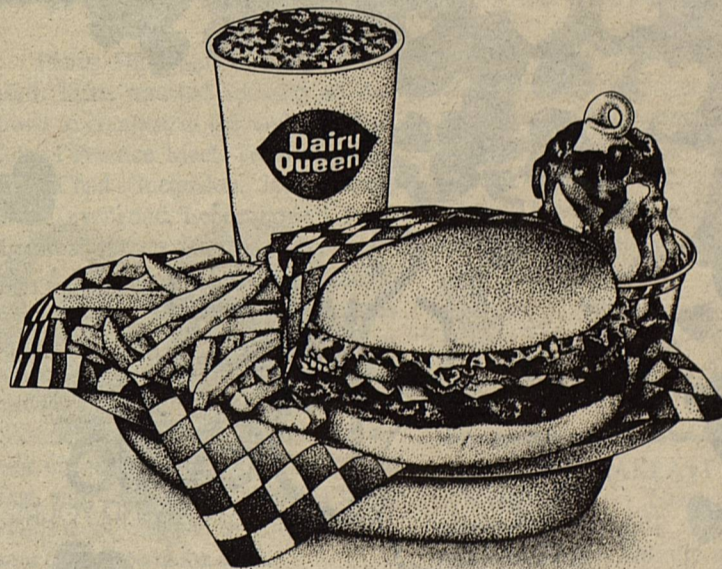

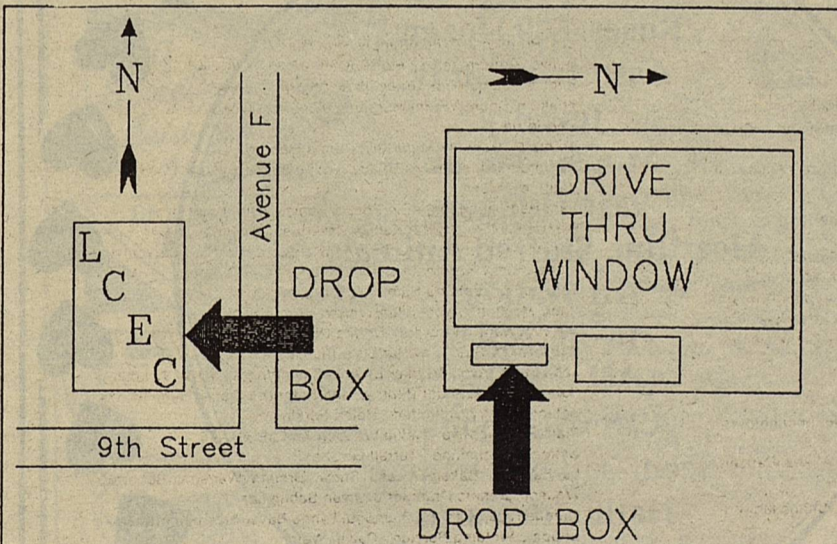

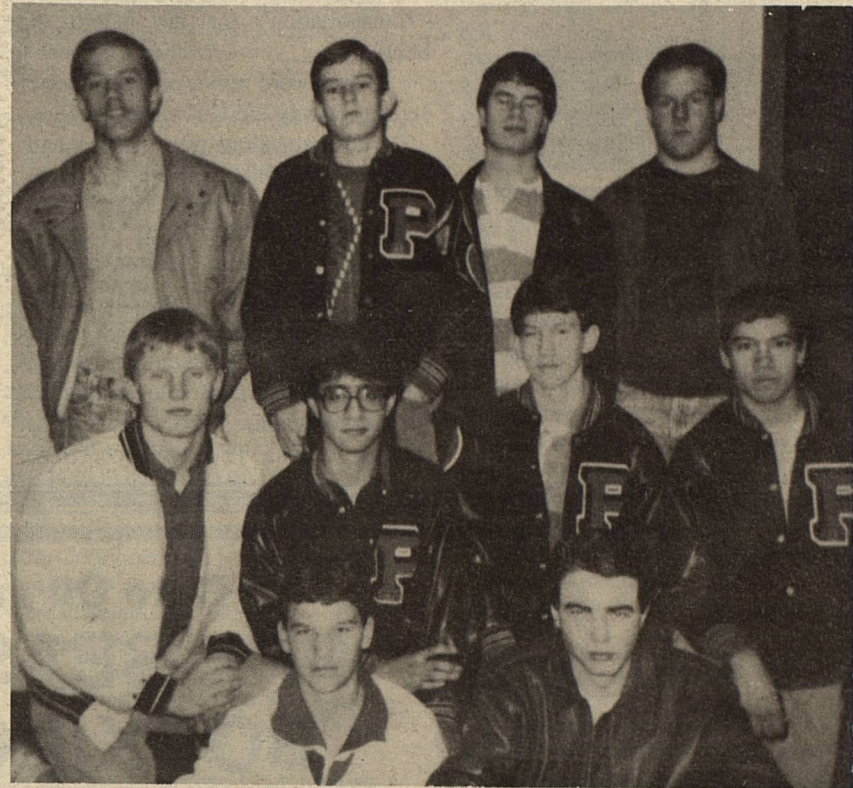


Those of you who have been involved with the extra-curricular activities of any school, are aware of The University Interscholastic League. The U.I.L. is the governing organization for school activities and is regulated by the Texas Education Agency and an elected Legislative Committee. The U.I.L. has authority over all school extra-curricular activities. However, most of the publicity for U.I.L. seems to be negative. We hear of the instances when a school is ruled ineligible for rule violation, or when a school might be placed on probation for infraction of rules. The positive aspects of the U.I.L. are not often in the news.

One of the by-products of the U.I.L. is the Texas Interscholastic League Foundation. This foundation has one purpose: To identify academically talented Texas high school students and provide them with the means for fullest development of their talents. Selection of these exceptionally talented young Texans is accomplished through the University Interscholastic League academic contests. Through elimination at district, regional, and state levels, the highly intelligent, energetic, and determined, are selected for financial assistance in pursuing their education. This aid, in many cases, is provided through scholarships from the Texas Interscholastic League Foundation.

Since 1958, the T.I.L.F. has awarded 5,929 scholarships for a total value of \$5,587,750.00. We had two students who received scholarships through T.I.L.F. last year, and are very appreciative of the financial assistance. There were 336 T.I.L.F. scholarships awarded last year, and Plains High School received two of them. This is one area of the U.I.L. that does not receive enough publicity.

Plains Independent School District appreciates and supports the U.I.L., Dr. Bailey Marshall, Dr. Bill Forney and the entire staff for their work in leading the organization. It is the largest of its kind in the world. The U.I.L. is working hard to keep extra-curricular activities in perspective to the total educational program.

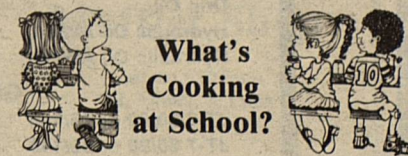

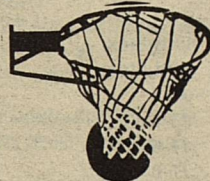

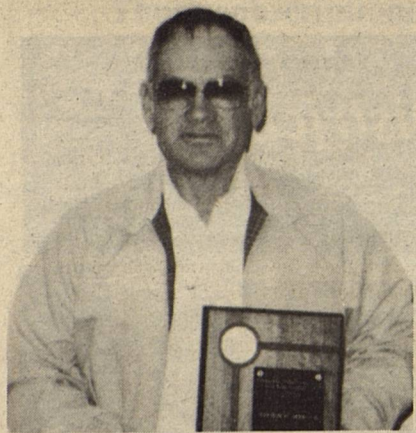
