## Annual Reunion To Begin Thursday With Parade

Thirty-eighth annual Old Settlers' Reunion and Rodeo will get underway here Thursday evening as the gala parade unwinds at 5:30 p.m. Festivities will continue Friday and Saturday. This year's theme is "A Salute to Freedom".

Rodeo competition will begin at 8 p.m. nightly with a cowboy dance following each performance. Stock will be provided by T-N-T Rodeo of Anson. The rodeo is TCRA and NMRA approved.

Events will include team roping, bareback, saddle bronc, bullriding, calf roping, steer wrestling, ladies break-away roping and ladies barrel races. Belt buckles will be awarded in each event.

Rodeo queen candidates are selling tickets for a saddle which will be given away Saturday evening.

Annual old settlers' barbecue will be held at 12 noon in Stanford Park and will feature barbecue and the trimmings. Ladies of the community are asked to bring cobblers and potato salad. Tickets are \$5 for adults and \$4 for children under 12 and are good for admission to Saturday night's rodeo performance.

An ex-student reunion buffet will be served at the La Familia Restaurant (located across from the Courthouse) beginning at 6 p.m. on Friday, Aug. 2.

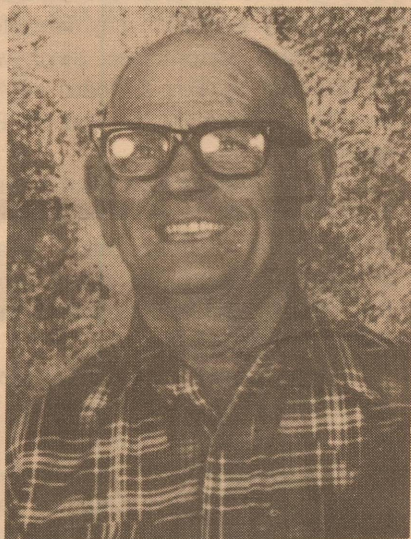

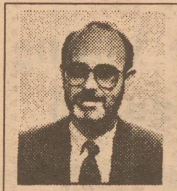

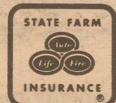

Mr. Hogan died at 1:25 a.m. Saturday in Yoakum County Hospital after a sudden illness.

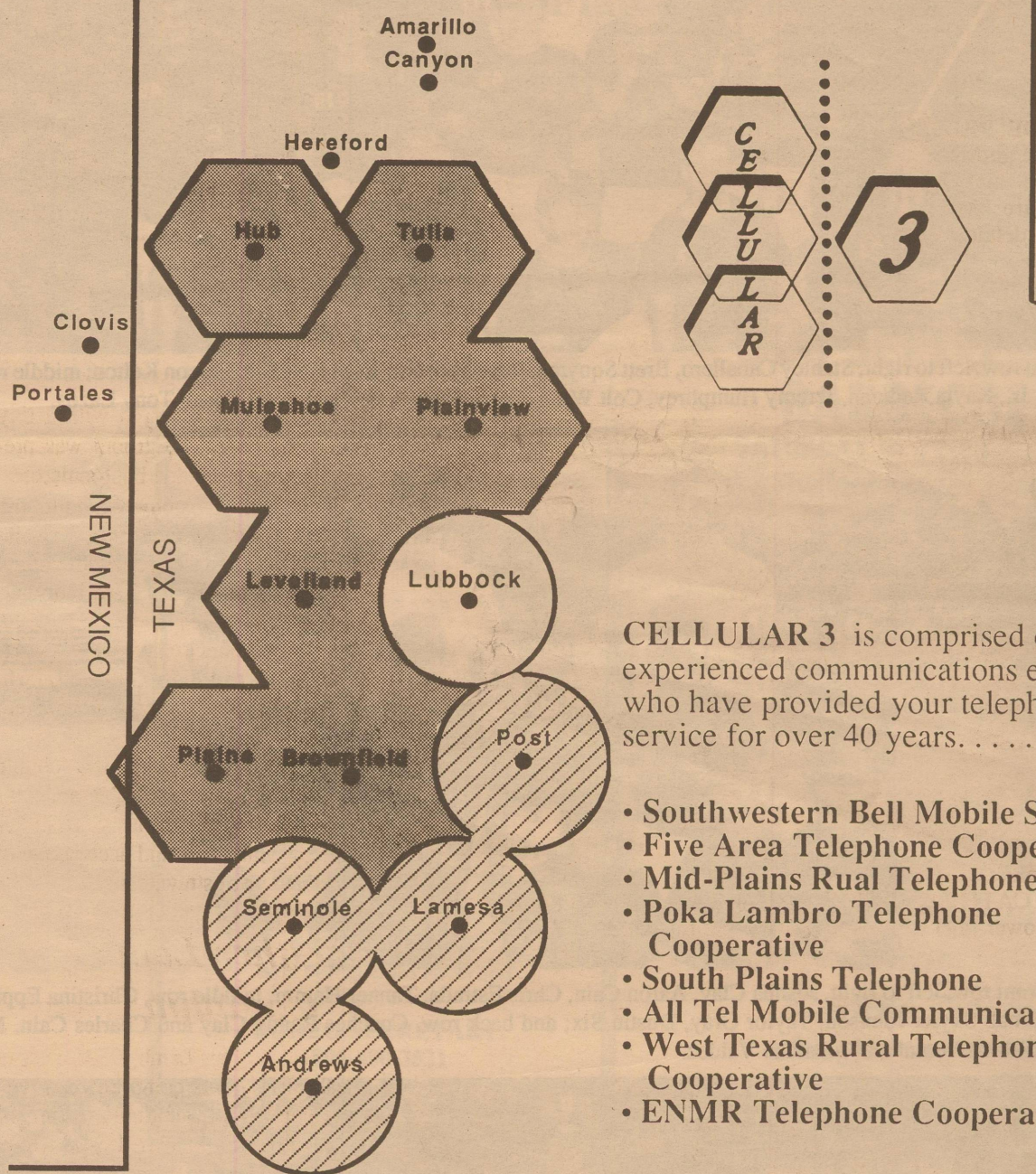
