Peanut Contracts Due Sept. 13

Texas State ASC Committee, reminds peanut producers and handlers, that contracts drawn up to sell 1991-crop additional peanuts for export or crushing must be filed by September 13. Additional peanuts are those grown in excess of the farm's poundage quota or on a The infant was born Aug. 20 in a farm that does not have a poundage quota.

> "Peanut producers and handlers are responsible for contract agreements," Harris said, "and they should examine the documents closely before signing to assure that they are correct in all respects."

Peanut contracts submitted to ASCS for approval must contain certain specific information. Producers and handlers who are unfamiliar with the required information may contact the Yoakum County ASCS Office for assistance. In addition to the required information, Harris said other items may be included; however, such items may not negate any of the required contract provisions.

"In the event of a contract dispute, our approval of the con-

Jerry Harris, Chairman of the tract does not constitute a determination of the respective rights and obligations of the handler and producer," ASCS official Harris said.

Peanut producers and handlers who have entered into contracts must submit the contracts to each respective contracting producer's local ASCS office by the September 13 deadline.


Literacy Classes Underway Here


Literacy classes got underway Wednesday evening and will continue to be held at 8:30 p.m. each Wednesday evening in the Heritage Room of Yoakum County Library.

NOTICE TO LIVESTOCK OWNERS

ALL BRANDS AND MARKS ON TEXAS LIVESTOCK MUST BE RERECORDED WITH COUNTY CLERKS WITHIN SIX MONTHS OF AUGUST 30, 1991 ACCORDING TO ARTICLE 6899j, VERNON'S TEXAS CIVIL STATUTES. (September 2,1991 thru February 28, 1992)

The owner shall have the right during this six-month period to file the brand and marks now recorded in his name. After this time any unrecorded brand will be available for use on a "first-come" basis.

It should be noted that it is illegal to brand livestock without first properly recording the brand with the County Clerk in the county in which the livestock are held.

When the brand or brands are recorded, the location on the animal on which the brand is to be applied must be designated. If the brand is to be applied to more than one location on the animal, it must be recorded and each additional location for the brand on the animal shall constitute a separate recording of that brand.

There is no limit to the number of brands and/or marks which may be recorded in a county by a person as long as requirements of this law governing the recording and rerecording of livestock brands are met. Minors may have marks or brands separate from that of the father or guardian, which must be recorded or rerecorded as provided by the law.

This notice concerns Sandy Landoperty tax rates for 1991 ... It presents information about three tax rates. Last year's tax rate is the actual rate the taxing unit used to determine property taxes last year. This year's effective tax rate would impose the same total taxes as last year if you compare properties taxed in both years. This year's rollback tax rate is the highest tax rate the taxing unit can set before taxpayers can start tax rollback procedures. In each case these rates are found by dividing the total amount of taxes by the tax base (the total value of taxable property) with adjustments as required by state law. The rates are given per \$100 of property value.
