You Can Vote As You Please Says Governor Daniel

AUSTIN — Voting in the Democratic Primary does not obligate anyone "legally or morally" to vote for the Democratic presidential nominee in the general election, Governor Price Daniel said today.

The pledge on the primary ballot applies only to nominees selected in that primary for state, district, and local offices, Daniel stated in an interview with a Dallas Morning News correspondent.

Daniel was asked for his views on the matter after a statement quoting him was issued by the State Democratic Executive Committee as follows:

"More than 1,500,000 Texans affiliated themselves with the Democratic Party this poll tax year, under provisions of state law. It is the responsibility of all affiliated Democrats to carry their great strength into the general election in support of the party nominees."

Daniel told the News he did not mean to imply that participation in the Democratic Primary obligated a voter to vote for that party's presidential and vice presidential nominees in the general election.

The election in Carbon will be held in the Hamner Building. W. H. Collins is Precinct Chairman but will not be able to serve in this capacity due to illness and Hubbard Gilbert will be substituting as election judge.

LOCAL RIVER FLOOD PLANS UNDER STUDY

Plans for a Flood Prevention Project on the Sabanno River moved ahead with the naming of a temporary working committee by the Upper Leon Soil Conservation District supervisors at their regular meeting October 21. This committee will direct work on the project until a permanent organization is elected.

This program is jointly being sponsored by Businessmen's clubs from DeLeon, Gorman, Carbon, and Rising Star. Each club is to name a member to assist the working committee on this project.

Carruth, Rt. 1, DeLeon; Charlie Glenn Carruth, Rt. 1, DeLeon; Dean Pounds, DeLeon; Dr. D. V. Rogers, Gorman; Commissioner Murry Sides, DeLeon; Oscar Schaefer, Cisco; B. A. Butler, Rising Star; Cecil Schultz, Rising Star; Clarence Stroebel, Rt. 1, Rising Star; and H. A. Tyrone, Rt. 1, Carbon.

Appointed to represent the Upper Leon Board of Supervisors is C. M. McCain of Eastland. A meeting of this group will be called in the near future to plan community meetings in the watershed. At these meetings information will be given to all land owners in the watershed concerning the Upstream Flood Prevention program and what should be done

Eastland County Has 1,347 Farms In Census Count

The 1959 Census of Agriculture, conducted in Eastland County last fall, counted 1,347 farms, according to a preliminary report just issued by the Bureau of the Census, U. S. Department of Commerce. Total land in farms was 488,952 acres. The average size of farm was 362.5 acres. The average land value of farms (land and buildings) in the county was \$21,911.

Of the county's farm operators, 718 owned their farms, 417 owned part of the land and rented additional acreage, and 205 were tenant farmers.

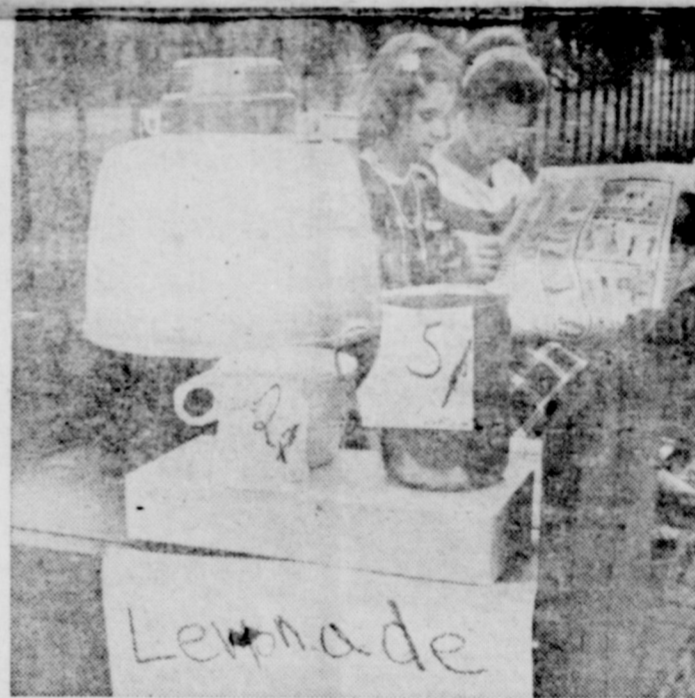
The average age of farm operators in the county was 53.5 years. There were 299 farm operators 65 or more years of age.

Of the 1,347 farms in the county, 715 were commercial farms.

Detailed statistics on crops, livestock, equipment, etc., are presented in the preliminary report, with comparable statistics for 1954. Copies of the county report may be obtained for 10 cents each from the Bureau of the Census, Washington 25, D. C.

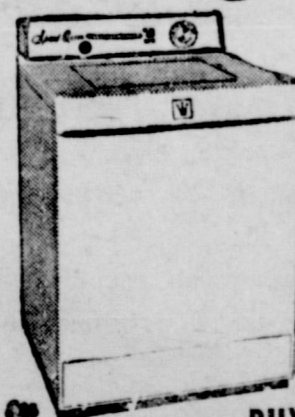
