## Glenn Justice Is Named To State FB Post

Glenn Justice, president of the Eastland County Farm Bureau, Route 2, Gorman, has been named to serve on the 1960 State Commodity Advisory Committee according to a statement released last week by the office secretary, Mrs. Irby Tucker White. The appointment was made following the annual Texas Farm Bureau convention in November.

Purpose of the committee, composed of representatives of the various commodities over the state, is to act in an advisory capacity to the state FB Board of Directors in developing recommendations for carrying through on the 1960 program of work as outlined by the voting delegates at the annual convention.

Justice invites farmers and ranchers to express their wishes and offer any suggestions on commodity problems which come under the consideration of the committee. "It is the thinking of the farmers and ranchers that puts 'The Voice of Agriculture' on the march for a better economy and a better way of life for the rural people.

Justice was in Waco last week to attend a meeting of the Farm Bureau.

Oscar M. (Hop) White, Jr., native resident of the county, has authorized The Press to announce that he will be a candidate for the office of Sheriff of Eastland County in the Democratic Party election this year. He is a resident of Cisco.

Mr. White, who is 36 years old, has been a driller for the Low Drilling Company here for the past six years. He was born and raised at Rising Star where his parents, Mr. and Mrs. Oscar White, Sr., still live. Mr. White is married, and they have two sons, ages 6 and 11. Mr. White is a member of the First Baptist Church, and Mrs. White is a member of the Church of Christ.

At Rising Star High School, Mr. White was an outstanding athlete, starring in football, basketball and track. He attended Allen Academy one year before entering Texas A&M College where he won the heavy-weight boxing championship and lettered three years in football, basketball and track. He made the second all-conference basketball quintet.

An Associated Press story was released about Mr. White as follows: "Oscar White of Rising Star is a near approach to the immortal Bill Henderson in Texas A&M College athletics. Henderson, who wound up his string several years ago, lettered in any sport he attempted and was hailed as the nation's most versatile college athlete. White the other night won the heavyweight boxing title of this 4,600-man school. He already had two letters each in football and basketball and one in track. In the latter sport he is on the way to still another numeral. White is an end in football, forward in basketball and a hurdler in track."

Mr. White said he planned to see as many of the voters as possible before the May 7th first primary.

"I will appreciate the consideration of every voter," he said. "Everyone is invited to examine my record in all respects. If elected, I will make every effort to handle the duties of sheriff in an efficient manner."

### Vets Questions And Answers

Q — I named the beneficiaries of my GI insurance policy some time ago, but never did specify the method of payment. If I should die while the method of payment is still undesignated, how would the insurance money be paid out?

A — It would be paid in 30 equal installments. However, your first beneficiary would have the right to those payments under any other installment plan available.

Q — A veteran of my acquaintance is drawing extra pension payments because he requires constant nursing care. Would his extra payments be stopped if a member of his family provided this care, other than someone outside his family hired for the purpose?

A — No. The extra payments would still continue if the nursing care is provided by a member of his family. The law does not specify who shall provide the regular aid and attendance necessary.

Q — Each month I get a check from VA for a disability I received while fighting in Korea. Will the amount of this check be changed because of the new pension law?

A — No. The new law applies only to veterans who receive pensions for non-service connected disabilities, and the widows and orphans of war veterans who died of non-service connected injuries or illness. Your check is compensation for service-connected disability. It will not be affected by the new pension law.

Q — I closed my GI home loan with a lender in June of 1959, a month before the new 5 1/4 interest rate became effective. Does the new rate affect me in any way?

A — No. The new law in no way affects veterans who closed their loans before July 2, 1959. You go on making your payments to your lender just as you have been at the interest rate which applied when you closed your loan.

Almond Chicken With Rice

Chinese Chicken Almond With Rice, a delightful delicately flavored dish with chicken, celery topping, is sure to please your family. It makes an attractive "one main dish type meal" and is easily served to a crowd. Fresh or canned mushrooms may be used for making Chinese Almond Chicken.

**INGREDIENTS**  
 1 cup uncooked rice  
 1 cup sliced mushrooms (canned or fresh)  
 1/2 cup almonds — blanched  
 2 tablespoons salad oil, to be used 1 tablespoon at a time  
 1 clove garlic, cut in half  
 1 teaspoon salt  
 1 cup cubed bamboo shoots (canned)  
 1/2 cup thinly sliced water chestnuts (canned)  
 1/2 cup thinly sliced celery  
 1 cup diced, cold chicken (fresh or canned)  
 1/2 tablespoons liquid (1 tablespoon each, from bamboo shoots and water chestnut cans)

**INGREDIENTS FOR GRAVY**  
 2 teaspoons cornstarch  
 1/2 teaspoon sugar  
 4 tablespoons water  
 4 teaspoons soy sauce

**GARNISH**  
 1/2 cup sliced green onion  
**PREPARING THE FLUFFY WHITE RICE**—To make 3 cups fluffy rice: Put 1 cup of uncooked rice, 2 cups of cold water and 1 teaspoon of salt in a two-

quart saucepan and cover with a tight-fitting lid. Bring to a vigorous boil. Then reduce the heat as low as possible and steam for 14 minutes or until all the water is absorbed, leaving the separate rice grains with their full nutritional value. This makes very firm rice grains. If you prefer more tender rice grains, add 1/2 cup more water and increase the slow cooking time 4 or 5 minutes. Remove the lid, permit the rice to steam dry to the desired consistency and the grains will be separate and fluffy. Never stir rice; lift gently with a fork.

**METHOD:** Brown almonds in 1 tablespoon oil. Set aside. With table fork, mash garlic into salt in skillet. (Be sure there is a tight-fitting cover, which can be used later.) Add 1 tablespoon oil, then add chicken. Brown lightly. Add 1 tablespoon oil and then bamboo shoots and mushrooms. Brown lightly. Add liquid, drained from canned bamboo shoots and water chestnuts. Cover tightly. Cook over low heat 5 minutes. Add water chestnuts, celery and 1/2 of the almonds. Just heat through. Celery and chestnuts should remain crisp. For gravy... shake up in small jar, cornstarch, salt, sugar, water and soy sauce. Stir into mixture. Cook until liquid thickens and is smooth. Sprinkle over dish, green onions and rest of almonds. Serve with hot fluffy cooked rice. This will serve 4.

### Vets Questions And Answers

Q — I am a veteran of the Korean War who has been out of service two years. I have a disability I believe is service-connected. If the claim I intend filing with VA is approved, will I be entitled to compensation retroactive to my first day as a civilian?

A — No. Compensation may be made retroactive to a veteran's first day in civilian life only if he applied within one year from his discharge and VA finds the disability was compensable at that time. If a veteran fails to apply within a year from discharge, payments may date from the time of application only.

Q — Can a veteran with a service-connected hearing disability, who must wear a hearing aid, have it repaired or replaced at any time as a part of his VA benefit, as long as there is medical need?

A — Yes. As long as the disability is service-connected, and there is medical need for repair or replacement of a prosthetic appliance, the repair or replacement will be made by VA.
