Pecan Growers Vote To Hold Annual Show In Cisco Again

Fire Prevention

Each year the pupils of Carbon High School write themes and make posters during Fire Prevention Week, stressing the importance of fire prevention. Fire Prevention Week always falls in October on the date of the great Chicago fire, and its observance in schools gets lower fire insurance rates for the people of the community.

The following theme is one written this year by Betty Bond, a sophomore:

The prevention of fire is one of the most important responsibilities that the citizens of a country have. Fire prevention is left entirely to each of us as individuals.

Each year there are many, too many, homes and lives destroyed by that horrible, scorching element called fire. Nearly all fires are caused by someone's careless actions. It should be everyone's alertness that prevents fires.

There are numbers of ways in which one can prevent fires. The most important place there is to practice fire prevention is in one's home. Many fires are caused by defects in electrical wiring in homes. As a precaution against fire in this way, one should have the wiring inspected by a licensed inspector each year. This inspection may seem costly when one pays the bill, but he should think about the things dear to his heart that he may be saving from a burning inferno.

Another thing that people should be cautious about is throwing away matches and cigarettes before the flame is entirely smothered. People should take extra precaution when throwing these things away, because a fire could catch easily, spread fast, and destroy much.

Our state is a beautiful state, with people in it who are proud to be Texans and who deserve to be called good citizens of the United States, but how can people continue to be deserving citizens if they fail to try to the best of their ability to prevent that horrible killer and destroyer, fire?

Pecan growers of Eastland and adjoining counties will hold their 1957 show in Cisco on December 14 and 15, it was reported today by Manager Paul Brashear of the Chamber of Commerce. This is the fourth annual show.

Mr. Brashear was notified by County Agent J. M. Cooper that the pecan growers voted almost unanimously to hold their show in Cisco again. The Chamber of Commerce will provide the prizes and will assist with arrangements for the show, Mr. Brashear said.

It was expected that the county home demonstration clubs would hold a bake show and sale as they did last year and an announcement of this event is expected to be made soon.

Mr. Brashear said committees will be named by President J. P. McCracken of the Chamber of Commerce to help with all details of the show.

"We are pleased to have the growers return to Cisco for the annual show," Mr. Brashear said. "The show is attracting more and more attention to the fact that this is one of the nation's finest pecan producing areas."

Talk On Progress Of Oil Is Made

Bill Huffman, Cisco, in a talk last week pointed out that many years ago oil was used by the Greeks and that Indians used oil for medicine. The first oil well was drilled in 1859 at Titusville, Pennsylvania, and was called "Drakes Folly." The petroleum industry was created for the profit, Huffman stated.

Today oil is used in all types of businesses, according to Mr. Huffman. Petroleum is used to make fabrics, cosmetics, foods, medicines, and countless other products. Huffman reported that today there are over 42,000 business units in the petroleum industry, not including 220,000 service stations and many other related industries.

Texas, Oklahoma, and California produce 70 per cent of the world's oil, he stated. Texas alone produces 50 per cent.

Doleful Senators Due Shock When Ike Wins, Fears Doc

One of the strongest Eisenhower men in our town is Doc Brown. Doc says he just can't put up with Stevenson's socialized medicine program; there are a lot of other things he doesn't like about Adlai, but that one is enough for him, he says. Doc is a pretty outspoken cuss, but he's a good doctor. At least, he's the best one in town, being the only one, and our people always call him when they get sick whether they like his politics or not.

The other day several of us were standing around in front of the post office, talking politics—some Eisenhower men and some for Stevenson—when Doc walked up looking glum. One of the Stevenson men said: "Hey, Doc, what's the trouble, did Ike just call you in some bad news?"

Doc Brown said no, he hadn't heard from Ike this week, but he was worried.

"Not about Ike, you understand," he told the Stevenson fellow. "Ike has got it made. Even the Stevenson people are beginning to admit that. Poor old Adlai isn't going to get any farther in this race than he could throw Kefauver's coonskin cap with the tail cut off."

"The ones I am worried about are these out-of-state senators who are coming down here to Texas to tell us how to vote. I sure feel sorry for those boys. It must be tough to face life with their attitude."

"To hear them tell it, this country is in a terrible shape. All the farmers are starving, all

the businessmen are going broke, and all the working people are just barely making enough to keep body and soul together. The only reason some little country doesn't step in and whip us tomorrow is that they know they can just wait a few days and the United States will fold up of its own accord. That's what I understand from listening to the visiting senators.

"Of course, they know how to correct the situation overnight. Elect Adlai, and let him abolish the draft, and do away with the H-bomb, and let Estes establish the Atlantic Union which he has made speeches about all over the country, and everything will be all right."

"These things are too important, of course, for these senators to waste time telling us Texans why they voted against the Texas tidelands bill."

"As a medical man, I am worried about the great shock these senators are going to get, after the election is over and Ike is elected and this country keeps on being peaceful, prosperous and progressive. It's liable to put them all in bed."

And Doc Brown walked on off, shaking his head. Of course, the Stevenson man caught on that Doc was hurrahing him, and he didn't like it much, but he'll still have to call him the next time one of the kids gets the croup, because like I said he's the only doctor in town.

Emergency Feed Grain Program Extended Again

Walter T. McKay, state director, Farmers Home Administration, today advised Homer P. Cole, county supervisor of the extension of the Emergency Feed Grain Program in Eastland County. Under this extension, farmers and ranchers may now file applications through December 31, 1956, for a supply of feed grain necessary to carry basic livestock herds through December 31, 1956.

This extension of the Emergency Feed Grain program now coincides with the assistance available under the Roughage Program for Texas, and enables county FHA committees to consider total feed requirements, both roughage and grain, through December 31, 1956.

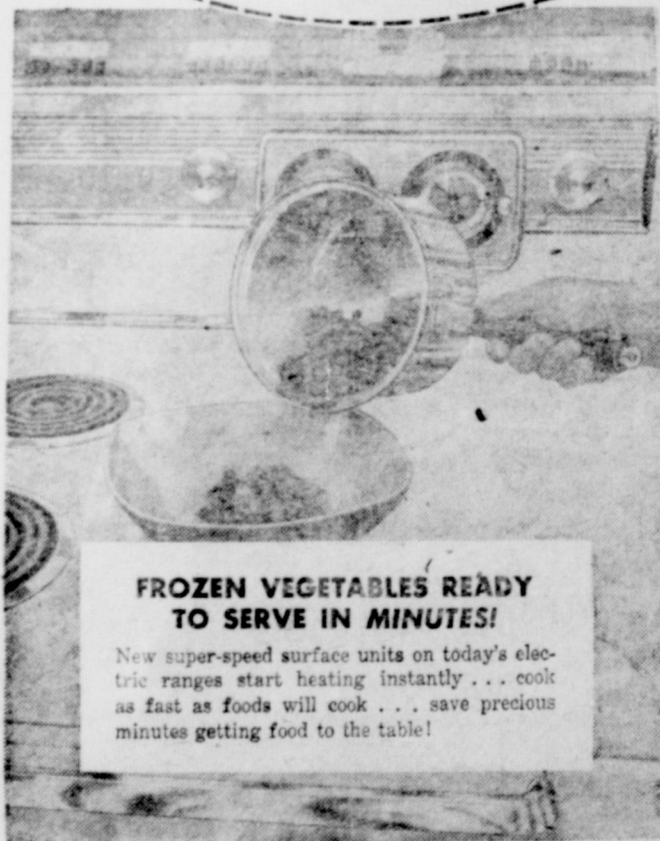
