County High On List Top Pecan Growers In U. S.

Eastland County rated high in a recent census of pecan trees on United States farms conducted by the Department of Commerce. The Bureau of Census of the department this week released the figures showing that pecan trees of all ages on United States farms numbered 7,489,457 with 4,580,818 or 61.2 per cent in 100 leading counties. Pecans harvested in 1954 amounted to 28,578,225 pounds in the leading 100 counties.

Dougherty County, Georgia was the leading county in number of trees with three per cent of the U. S. total. Comanche County, Texas, and San Saba County, Texas ranked fourth and fifth, respectively, in number of trees and third and fourth in pounds harvested.

The top 100 counties in number of pecan trees in 1954 were distributed by states as follows: Texas, 42; Georgia, 22; Oklaho-

Application for the 1957 Wheat Acreage Reserve Program are now being signed, according to an announcement by the United States Department of Agriculture's ASC office in Eastland.

Eastland County has been allocated \$17,000 for this program and the "first come, first served" basis will be used in distribution, the announcement said.

The greatest amount that can be placed in the soil bank is one-half of the allotment or 50 acres, whichever is greater. The smallest amount is three acres or the allotment, whichever is smaller.

The acreage placed in the reserve program must not have a crop harvested or grazed during 1957.

Those interested in placing any of their 1957 wheat acreage in the soil bank were asked to contact the County ASC office in Eastland. Deadline for signing of applications is September 21, 1956.

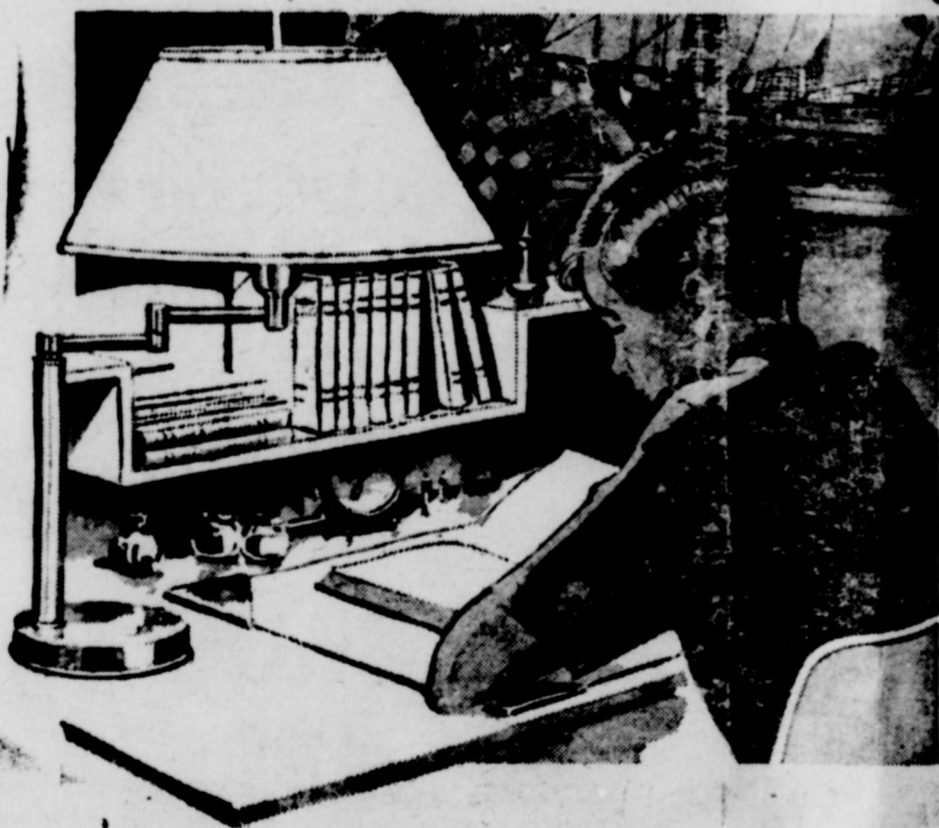

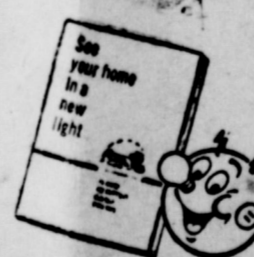
