
Schools Will Get More Federal Aid In Lunch Program

COLLEGE STATION, Aug. 8. - Texas public schools will get about 22 percent more funds from the U. S. Department of Agriculture than last year to serve noonday meals under the National School Lunch Program.

This announcement was received today by Dr. J. W. Edgar, Commissioner of Education, Texas Education Agency.

First quarter allocation of this money will be made to Texas this month, according to John J. Slaughter, chief, southwest food distribution division, Dallas.

This office of the Agricultural Marketing Service deals with the states in this region on the National School Lunch Program. Slaughter explained that the 22





