The national average support price for 1956 crop peanuts will be \$277.04 a ton compared with \$244.80 for the 1955 crop. The announcement of the price came from the U.S. Agriculture Department.

Last year's crop was supported at 90 per cent of parity and the new support price is based on 86 per cent of the parity price of peanuts. In explaining the use of the parity standard, the Agriculture Department said that parity is a standard for setting farm prices declared by law to be fair to farmers in relation to prices they pay for goods and services. Peanuts types and the compar-

ative prices for this year and last are as follows:

Southwestern Spanish, \$233:43 and \$237.

Southeastern Spanish, \$230.30 and \$241.

Virginia, \$242.98 and \$236. Runners, \$212.56 and \$220. Valencias, suitable for cleaning and roasting, \$231.83 and \$236. Loans to individual producers and growers associations will support the grower prices.


Eastland County Designated For Emergency Feed
