A total membership of 78,000 is the 1956 goal of the Texas Farm Bureau, according to an announcement made by Millard Shivers at a District 7 Farm Bureau meeting held in Brownwood on Wednesday. Mr. Shivers is the organizational director of the state group.

The membership quota given to Eastland County in the current campaign is 425 and Comanche County has been given a goal of 400. Veterans Advised To Redeem Leave **Bonds For Saving**

WASHINGTON, D. C., May 29 -Uncle Sam has \$26 million he's anxious to pay out to 130,000 ex-G. I.'s holding Armed Forces Leave Bonds that have drawn no interest since 1951.

The Treasury suggests that the money be re-invested in United States Series E Savings Bonds, which pay 3 per cent compound semi-annually when held to

The \$26 million is all that's left of more than two billion dollars paid to reimburse for unused leave those World War II veterans discharged between April 1, 1943 and October 1, 1946. The five-year bonds carried an interest rate of 21/2 per cent a year. A special act of Congress in

1947 made the bonds redeemable prior to maturity after September 1 of that year. Some \$1.5 billion were cashed within the next few months, but the remainder were held to draw additional interest. However, the last of these matured on October 1, 1951, and have drawn no interest since that date.



UNUSED COTTON, PEANUT LAND WILL BE RE-ALLOCATED SOON

Re-allocation of unused cotton and peanut acreages which have been released by the producers will be made within the next few days by the County Committee, according to an announcement from the Eastland County A.S.C.

office. The producers receiving some of the additional acreage will be notified.

In stating the rules for stripping cotton and peanuts, the A.S.C. office said that if these two crops are stripped with crops that compete with the allotment crops for moisture and plant food for the entire growing season, only that part of the land occupied by the allotment crop will be counted.

The announcement added that idle or fallow strips must be at least four normal rows wide, and that crops that do not compete the entire growing season must be four rows wide. The same row width must be used for allotment crops and the strip.

Producers were advised that if there was any doubt as to the strip competing with the allotment crop, it would be advisable to make the strip four rows wide.
