SVGPA Meets; Barbecue Planned

The program presented by the Eastland County Soil Conservation group at the meeting of the Sabanno Valley Game Preserve Association Tuesday, May 8, was well received by the considerable turnout of association members, and justly so since it was "right up our alley." In other words, it got right down to where we live, namely the soil, and have to hold on to it. Owing to the fact that scarcely a week before most of us had seen some of our best soil swept right out from under us by the flood of May 1 and 2, we kept awake and paid strict attention. Mr. McAlester and Mr. Gains of the group made interesting and informative talks on the importance of cover crops in holding the soil and aiding in moisture penetration. An interesting film along this line was also shown together with enlarged still photographs. Mr. McAlester had still more films to show but time did not permit. It is hoped we can have these men with us again soon and can see more films.

Mr. Robert G. Mauerman, Wild Life Biologist of the State Fish and Game Commission at Austin, arrived in the county May 15 and spent the day touring the Preserve area and inspecting the range as to its suitability for the stocking of deer. He seemed to be favorably impressed and said he would approve the area for an absolute minimum of 15,000 acres of solidly blocked land to be signed up with the state before the deer could be brought in. So from now on it is up to the people of the area. If they want deer they can get them. If they don't want them they won't get them.

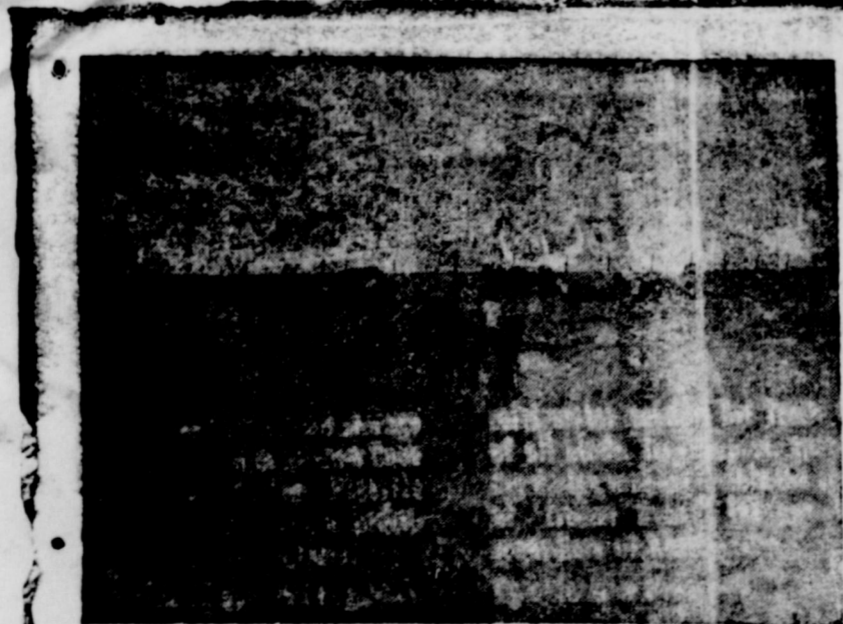

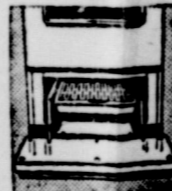
