AGENT OFFERS HINTS HOW TO CUT COST OF YOUR FOODS

If you're an average American, you ate your way through \$435 worth of food in 1954, and chances are you'll spend the same or more this year unless you plan carefully to cut costs.

The fact that we're eating out more than we used to and buying more highly processed and more expensive foods accounts for the increase in family costs in the last ten years.

Here are some ways to cut food costs, which are most beneficial:

1. Buy the "makings" instead of ready baked and ready-cooked foods — unless time is more important to you than money.

2. Grow some of your own groceries in a garden. If you live on a farm, produce your own meat

and milk, poultry, eggs.

3. Freeze or freeze fresh vegetables and fruit for use when the price of fresh produce hits a seasonal high peak.

4. Prevent food waste.

7. You need more detailed suggestions for planning the food supply, planning meals, growing a garden, or freezing and canning, either write us, or drop by our office when you are in town.

Does your family like cherry pie? Then you might be interested in trying my recipe for Spicy Cherry Pie for a change.

To make the crust you:

Blend together 22 ginger snaps rolled fine or 1 2/3 cups crumbs, 1/4 cup softened butter or margarine and 1/8 cup sugar. Pour mixture into a 9-inch pie plate; firmly press into an even layer against bottom and sides of plate. Bake in moderately hot oven (375°F.) for about 8 minutes. Cool.

For the filling you do the following:

1/2 cup sugar
4 Tablespoons cornstarch
1 teaspoon cinnamon
1/2 teaspoon nutmeg
1 1/2 cups cherry juice
2 No. 2 cans pitseed cherries, well drained

Thoroughly mix together sugar, cornstarch, cinnamon, and nutmeg in a saucepan; blend in cherry juice. Cook over medium heat; stir until sauce thickens and clears. Fold in cherries; cool. Pour into ginger snap crumb crust; chill. Top with whipped cream before serving if desired.

Hope you try this recipe. Your family will love it!

Director Reports Many Cars Still Need Inspection

AUSTIN, March 3. — Two million Texas auto owners were handed a word of warning today by Col. Homer Garrison, Jr., Director of the Texas Department of Public Safety.

The Safety Director pointed out that that number of the State's registered vehicles have not yet secured safety inspections for 1956.

"Some two million autos in the State," said Garrison, "have not

been inspected. That represents about half of the total number of motor vehicles registered in Texas and there remains but six weeks in the current inspection period during which these cars must be taken to licensed inspection stations for their annual safety check."

The Commission on the minimum requirements for duty in the Bureau of Indian Affairs in the western states and in Alaska, and for Student Trainee (Engineer), \$2,960 to \$3,415 a year, for duty with the Bureau of Reclamation in the western states and in Alaska.

Experience is required for each position. A combination of education and experience. For the lowest grade of each position, education alone may be qualifying. The Student Trainee (Engineer) positions are open to first, second, and third year college students majoring in civil, electrical, or mechanical engineering. A written test will be given. The minimum age limit for these trainee positions is 17 years.

Further information and application forms may be obtained at the Cisco Post Office or from the U. S. Civil Service Commission, Washington, 25, D. C. The material obtained will contain instructions on where to file applications. For Student Trainee positions, applications must be received or postmarked not later than March 7, 1956. Accidents

United Rice and Tuna and Thrifty Filling for Luscious Tomatoes

Rice brings together the deep goodness of tuna fish and the Oriental excitement of curry in this versatile main dish. The curry has a distinctive exotic flavor and intriguing color enhanced by the bits of green pepper and the brilliant red of the tomato.

Served piping hot from the oven or cold and refreshing on a bed of greens, this "something special" for the family is also something quick and easy for Mom to fix.

INGREDIENTS:
 2 medium sized ripe tomatoes
 4 tablespoons minced onion
 2 tablespoons minced green pepper
 2 tablespoons butter or margarine
 7-ounce can tuna fish
 1 cup uncooked rice
 1 teaspoon curry powder
 1/2 teaspoon salt
 1/2 cup water

REPARING THE FLUFFY WHITE RICE: To make 3 liberal cups of fluffy rice, put 1 cup of uncooked rice, 2 cups of cold water and 1 teaspoon of salt into a 2 quart saucepan and bring to a vigorous boil. Turn the heat as low as possible. Cover saucepan with a lid and leave over this low heat for 14 minutes. Do not remove lid nor stir rice while it is cooking. Turn off the heat. Use exact measurements of uncooked rice and water. Time the cooking accurately.

For real convenience and economy of time and effort, keep uncooked rice in the refrigerator in a covered container at all times. Use it for many quick, delicious and inexpensive soups, salads, casserole dishes, hot breads and desserts.

METHOD: Peel tomatoes easily by scalding, plunging into cold water and then peeling. Slice off stem end of tomatoes. Carefully scoop out pulp. Cook onion and green pepper in the butter or margarine until tender. Add the tuna fish, rice, curry powder, salt, pepper and water. Mix thoroughly. Fill the tomatoes with the tuna and rice mixture and bake at 350° F. about 15 minutes or until the tomatoes are tender. Serve hot. Garnish with green pepper rings if desired.

For a cool and refreshing salad, chill the tomatoes after they are stuffed and serve on salad greens.

This recipe makes 8 servings or 3 cups of the curried tuna and rice mixture.
