Peanut Prospects Best In 5 Years

Eastland County, which ranks third among the state's leading peanut producing counties, has excellent prospects for an outstanding crop this fall, farm leaders reported Saturday. The county has between 30,000 and 35,000 acres in peanuts this year.

Zan Burroughs of the Cisco Peanut Company described the outlook at this time as the best since 1950. He added that more rainfall would be needed this month to keep the outlook at its present high level. Last year's crop was one of the lightest in the past five years.

The Southwestern Peanut Growers Association has reported that the loan advance to growers would be \$223 per ton on 70 base grade peanuts in this area. The support price is expected to amount to about the same as the loan advance, according to Mr. Burroughs.

The Eastland County ASC Office reported that work in measuring the 1955 acreage of both peanuts and cotton is about half finished.

County Agent J. M. Cooper advised that cotton fields were being sprayed for flea hopper, bollworms and bollweevils. Feed crops are looking good, he added. Pastures are in good shape compared with former years. Farm tanks contain an adequate supply of stock water.

Increasing demands was reported to be hiking the prices of watermelons in the area south of Cisco and around Rising Star. This was due to the decline of the supply of South and East Texas melons. Large numbers of trucks were in the area to haul melons to New Mexico and West Texas points. One large shipment left Rising Star for Walnut Grove, Minn., to take 24,000 pounds of watermelons to a super market. The farmers were getting about \$1 per 100 pounds or more for choice melons.

Crop and pasture prospects for most of the plains country of Texas continued to improve as timely showers were reported in many areas, according to the U. S. Department of Agriculture's weekly bulletin.

Senior Citizens Will Get Pension Hike In September

AUSTIN, Aug. 3. — Old people in Texas heaved a sigh of relief Thursday as Attorney General John Ben Shepperd ruled that they will begin receiving increased old age assistance benefits in September.

The bill passed by the Legislature provided for the additional \$7 million dollars in assistance to begin in September. But because the bill was passed by a voice vote, it ran into a constitutional snag providing that such bills cannot go into effect until 90 days after the session ends which would be September 6.

The delay in the effective date raised question as to whether the additional funds could be made available before October 1.

Shepherd ruled that the increased allocations for September could be made September 6. This permits payment of the increase for that month.

Farm Ponds Are Staked By SCS In Eastland County

A number of farm ponds were staked during the past few days by the work units of the Upper Leon Soil Conservation District, according to reports here today. Land owners cooperated with SCS personnel to find the best locations for the ponds — locations with suitable drainage area, with soil that will hold water and proper spillways.

Farm ponds were staked for Virgil Massingill, one mile east of Eastland; Sallie Bishop, 10 miles north of Gorman; J. W. Harper, six miles north of Eastland; B. M. Atwood, four miles east of Eastland; W. I. Brook, five miles southwest of Cisco; Lloyd Weddington, 15 miles southeast of Ranger; J. E. Weaver, five miles east of Carbon; W. H. Cooper, six miles north of Cisco; and J. M. Webb, four miles northwest of Eastland.

Farm ponds were completed and final checks made during the period on the farms of C. A. Perry, seven miles southwest of Cisco; Robert Donovan, eight miles northwest of Cisco; Billy Bacon, three miles south of Cisco; J. V. Heysler, Jr., five miles southwest of Nimrod; Virgil Massingill, one mile east of Eastland; Sallie Bishop, 10 miles north of Gorman, and W. H. Cooper, six miles northwest of Cisco.

Terraces and diversion terraces were run on the farms of Emery L. Booth of Cisco, Virgil Massingill of Eastland, and W. T. Booth of Cisco.

Terraces and diversion terraces were completed and final checks made on the N. A. Brown farm, Cisco; Bill Childers farm, five miles northwest of Cisco; and, Clyde Benton farm, six miles south of Eastland.

The district reported that Robert Donovan is giving 800 acres of his range land, north of Cisco, a summer deferment to increase the vigor and spread of his higher producing native grasses.

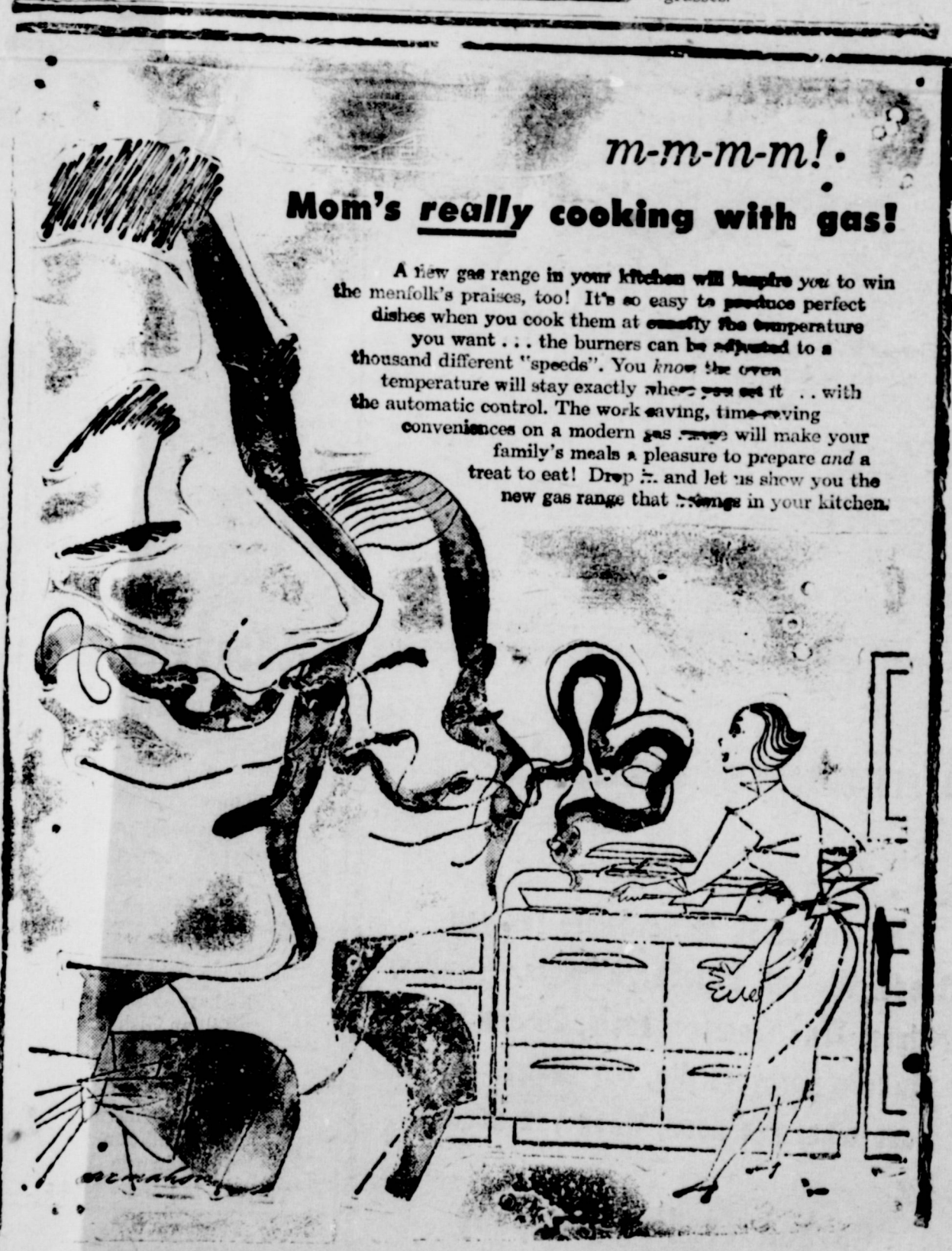

ton Building, Austin 14, now for an application blank. The blanks, when returned, must bear a \$5 check or money order to cover the special hunt fee. Ranchers are authorized to charge up to \$60 per head for antelope bagged.

The Chief Clerk said possibly a combined total of one thousand antelope will be harvested in both the Big Bend country and in the Panhandle. Technicians now are making population counts to determine the final total.

Bulk of the antelope will be earmarked for the hunt West of the Pecos where both buck and doe will be taken in some areas containing heavy population concentrations.

The Chief Clerk said an estimated six hundred fifty head will be bagged in the Big Bend, including possibly two hundred fifty doe antelope. Only buck antelope will be harvested in the Panhandle.

The Big Bend country shoot will be from October one through October ten and the one in the Panhandle will be from October twelve through October twenty.

The persons to receive license will be determined at separate drawings in the Cimmission headquarters early in September. The Chief Clerk advised hunters wishing to hunt as a party to send in their applications together.
