Deadline Near For Veteran Benefits

Veterans Administration reminded World War II veterans this week that they have one year in which to complete GI training and two years in which to apply for GI loans.

July 25, 1956, marks the end of the education program for all but a few of the World War II veterans now in training under the original GI Bill.

GI training payments to schools and veterans will stop on that date even though a veteran may still have unused training entitlement or be in the middle of a course.

The small group of veterans exempted from these two deadlines are those who enlisted or re-enlisted under the Armed Forces Voluntary Recruitment Act between October 6, 1945 and October 5, 1946. These veterans have nine years from the end of their enlistment or re-enlistment to finish GI training and ten years to apply for GI loans.

More than 90 percent of GI loans — 3,750,000 — have been for purchase of homes. More than 7,800,000 — or half of all who served in World War II — have received some sort of education under the GI Bill since 1944.

Only about 138,000 World War II veterans are still in training under the original GI Bill.

**Peanut Growers
Urged To Strive
For Top Grades**

Peanut growers are advised to "Harvest Peanuts for Top Grade" in the August issue of The Progressive Farmer magazine.

Irrigation may play an important role in producing top-grade peanuts. Irrigated peanut production was studied in 1953 and 1954 on six farms in Comanche and Erath Counties. There were drought conditions both years. In 1954 the irrigated peanuts out-yielded the dryland nuts 44 to 224 per cent. The non-irrigated peanuts graded 48 to 52 while the irrigated peanuts graded 65 to 73. With the 1954 bonus, 48 grade peanuts sold for \$1.85 per bushel and 73 grade peanuts brought \$4.90 per bushel.

Marvin C. Jones, Erath County farmer, had 71 acres in peanuts last year, 35 of which were irrigated. His dryland nuts made 13 bushels per acre and the irrigated peanuts averaged 43 bushels per acre.

Other factors may also affect the peanut grade. Growers are advised to avoid digging peanuts before they are mature.

S. E. Cloninger, manager of the Southwestern Peanut Growers Association, Gorman, advised farmers to make sure combine or harrow is adjusted to keep foreign material and shelled kernels to a minimum. Too, he finds many farmers bring their peanuts to market with too much moisture. The grower may avoid this by taking a sample to the buyer and have moisture content checked to see if his crop is ready for market.

Growers will find it pays to do everything possible to insure top-grade peanuts that will sell for top prices.

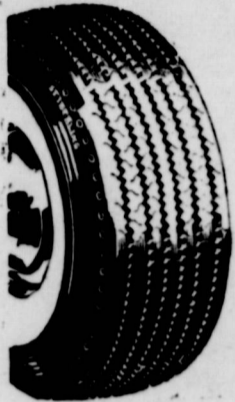

PROGRAM EXTENDED TWO YEARS USDA SPECIAL LIVESTOCK LOAN

Special livestock loans are made to established producers and feeders of cattle, sheep and goats (except commercial feedlot operators) who are temporarily unable to get from regular sources the credit needed to continue their normal operations.

To be eligible an applicant must have a good past record of livestock operations and have reasonable prospects for success with the help of the loan.

The loans are made to meet the usual expenses of livestock operations such as the purchase or production of feed and replacing or repairing of farm machinery. Loans also may be made for the restocking of herds to normal if the applicant can carry his present herd, plus the additional livestock to be purchased, without buying a substantial por-

tion of his feed. Loans are not made to pay existing debts except current incidental bills.

The loans are scheduled for repayment as soon as possible within a maximum period of three years. Other creditors are not asked to subordinate their liens but are expected to execute a standby agreement and agree that a reasonable part of the applicant's normal income from livestock can be used in repaying the loan.

Applications for special livestock loans may be made at the local county office of the Farmers, Home Administration at Eastland. The office is located on the 2nd floor of the Petroleum Building.
