Good Season For Hunters Is Seen By Game Agency

AUSTIN, July 17. — The Executive Secretary of the Game and Fish Commission said Texas hunters probably will enjoy a good season this fall despite shrinkage of such minor species as antelope and whitewing doves.

He said prospects are good for both mourning doves and waterfowl and added that the big game outlook is satisfactory. Even bobwhite quail reports are favorable for the first time in several years.

The Commission, at its recent regular meeting in Austin, voted against a season on antelope in both the Panhandle and West of the Pecos, and recommended a closed season on whitewing doves which have been on the downgrade for several years.

"It is not always sound conservation to forbid hunting just because some species are in low population," explained the Executive Secretary. "But the Big Bend antelope herds are in hard straits from the drought and the whitewings in the Valley almost got the coup de grace from the recent hurricane which caught the birds at the peak of their nesting and wrecked nests by the wholesale. There was some question about the Panhandle antelope status and the Commission judged the harvestable surplus not to be worth the trouble."

Three Buildings Ruined In Blaze At Rising Star

Three buildings were ruined by fire Monday night in the Rising Star business district, Fire Chief Lefty Sublett reported today. Cisco firemen took two trucks and the rescue unit to assist in fighting the blaze.

A building that housed a welding shop, garage and blacksmith shop and two adjoining structures a block east of the traffic light on the Comanche highway were ruined by the fire. It was reported that the three buildings were almost total losses. A grocery store and a feed store were in the other two structures.

Chief Sublett said the fire was almost under control by the time Cisco trucks arrived. Cisco was the only neighboring city that was called on for help. Cause of the blaze was not known here.
