HANGING OF JOHN PEARL

Murderer of Ed Tusker Meets His Death in Coleman Jail.

The end of the Tusker murder case was reached when John Pearl the perpetrator of the deed was hung at Coleman the 22nd. The following is an account of the hanging as given the Banner-Leader by Sheriff R. P. Kirk who was present:

He did not show any outward signs of nervousness and laughed and joked the night before. At 10 o'clock the death sentence was read and he was asked if he wished to make a statement. Going to a window of the jail he addressed a crowd of several hundred people for an hour and fifteen minutes when he was told time was up. He opened and closed his talk with prayer, and during his statement declared that he was innocent of the crime, and said that a man named Gray fired the shots but that he helped hide the body. His talk was rambling and disconnected and was mostly a warn. quence of a speech he made at a ing to young men againt drink ad bad associates.




