Pop Garrett To Seek Election As Superintendent

H. R. (Pop) Garrett, who has been a resident of Cisco and Eastland County since he came here in 1927 as athletic director of Randolph College, has announced his candidacy for the office of Eastland County School Superintendent subject to the action of the Democratic Primary in 1954.

Mr. Garrett, who is dean of Cisco Junior College, came to Cisco from Lincoln Memorial University in Tennessee where he served as athletic director for four years. Since moving to Cisco he has held administrative positions in the public schools and the junior college. He served as junior high school principal vice president of Cisco Junior College and his present post as dean of the school.

He is a graduate of Howard Payne College and Lincoln Memorial University, and has done post-graduate work at Hardin-Simmons University and the University of Michigan. He has had 30 years experience in classroom teaching and administrative work. He is listed in the Who's Who of American Education.

Mr. Garrett has long been active in the church and civic life of the community and the area. He is a member of the First Christian Church and has been one of the church officers for many years. He is a member of the Cisco Lions Club and is a past president of the club. He is a member of the Masonic Lodge and the Order of Eastern Star.

Mr. Garrett served as an officer in both World War I and World War II and is a member of both the American Legion and the Veterans of Foreign Wars. He also holds membership in the Texas Junior College Teachers Association, and has long been connected with youth projects of the community and the area.

Mr. and Mrs. Garrett live at their ranch home some five miles northwest of Cisco. He has three children: Mrs. G. Ray Heifrin of Dallas, the Rev. Jack K. Garrett of Seminole and Miss Dorothy Garrett, a teacher in the Dallas school system.

In making his announcement Mr. Garrett said that he felt that his 30 years of teaching and administrative duties gave him the necessary qualifications for the job, and that his experiences gave him a closer insight into the problems facing teachers, administrators and patrons.

Texas Leads For Number Of Tree Farms Planted

TRINITY, Dec. 23. — Texas leads the nation in Tree Farms — 486 certified Tree Farms aggregating 3,265,257 acres — but the chairman of the newly-formed Texas Forest Industries Committee believes that the state can

still do much better than that. Accordingly, Paul F. Hursey, manager of the Southland Paper Mills, Inc., Lumber Division, himself a graduate forester, is putting Tree Farm promotion high on the list of committee activities for the coming year.

A Tree Farm is an area of privately-owned land, any size, which is managed for the continuous production of timber of commercial value. The Texas Tree Farm System was initiated in 1944 under the joint sponsor-

ship of the Texas Forest Service, Texas Forestry Association and the East Texas Chamber of Commerce with the assistance of the Southern Pine Association. The problem is coordinated nationally by American Forest Products Industries, Inc., which also promotes the Keep Green movement.

"I believe we can substantially increase our Tree Farm acreage in 1954 with the cooperation of industry, private and state foresters, all working together with the small woodlot owners," said Mr. Hursey.

When a woodlot is recommended for certification as a Tree Farm, it must be inspected by a recognized forester who reports to the sponsoring agencies. To become a Tree Farmer, the woodlot owner must agree to follow management practices which include scientifically proven cutting methods and fire protection. The program calls for periodic inspections by foresters in order to maintain high Tree Farm standards. When a Tree Farm is certified, the owner may erect a Tree Farm sign as a symbol of good timber management.

Today one third of the state's commercial forestland is certified as meeting the rigid requirements of the sponsors for good management and protection. No other state has so high a proportion of its commercial forests in Tree Farms.

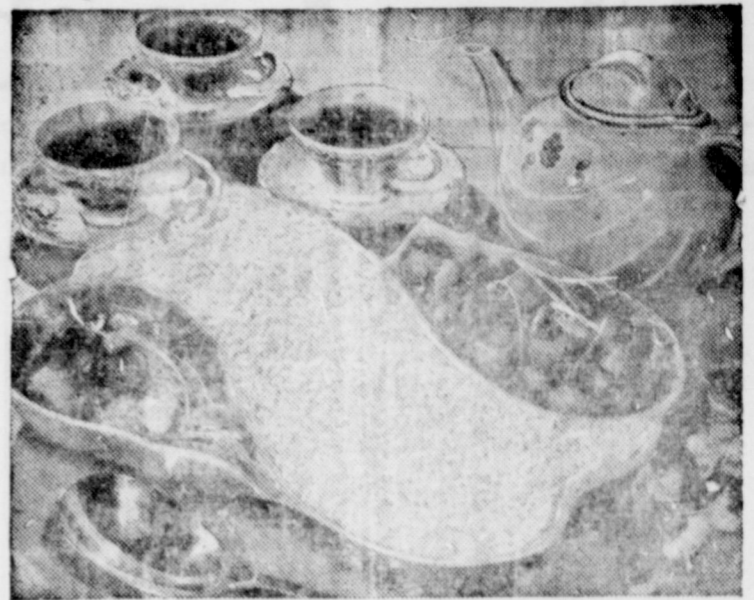

Almond Chicken With Rice

Chinese Chicken Almond With Rice, a delightful delicately flavored dish with chicken, celery topping, is sure to please your family. It makes an attractive "one main dish type meal" and is easily served to a crowd.

Fresh or canned mushrooms may be used for making Chinese Almond Chicken.

INGREDIENTS

- 1 cup uncooked rice
- 1/2 cup sliced mushrooms (canned or fresh)
- 1/2 cup almonds — blanched
- 3 tablespoons salad oil, to be used 1 tablespoon at a time
- 1 clove garlic, cut in half
- 1 teaspoon salt
- 1 cup cubed bamboo shoots (canned)
- 1/2 cup thinly sliced water chestnuts (canned)
- 1/2 cup thinly sliced celery
- 1 cup diced, cold chicken (fresh or canned)
- 1/2 tablespoons liquid (1 tablespoon each, from bamboo shoots and water chestnut cans)

INGREDIENTS FOR GRAVY

- 2 teaspoons cornstarch
- 1/2 teaspoon sugar
- 1/2 tablespoons water
- 1/2 teaspoons soy sauce

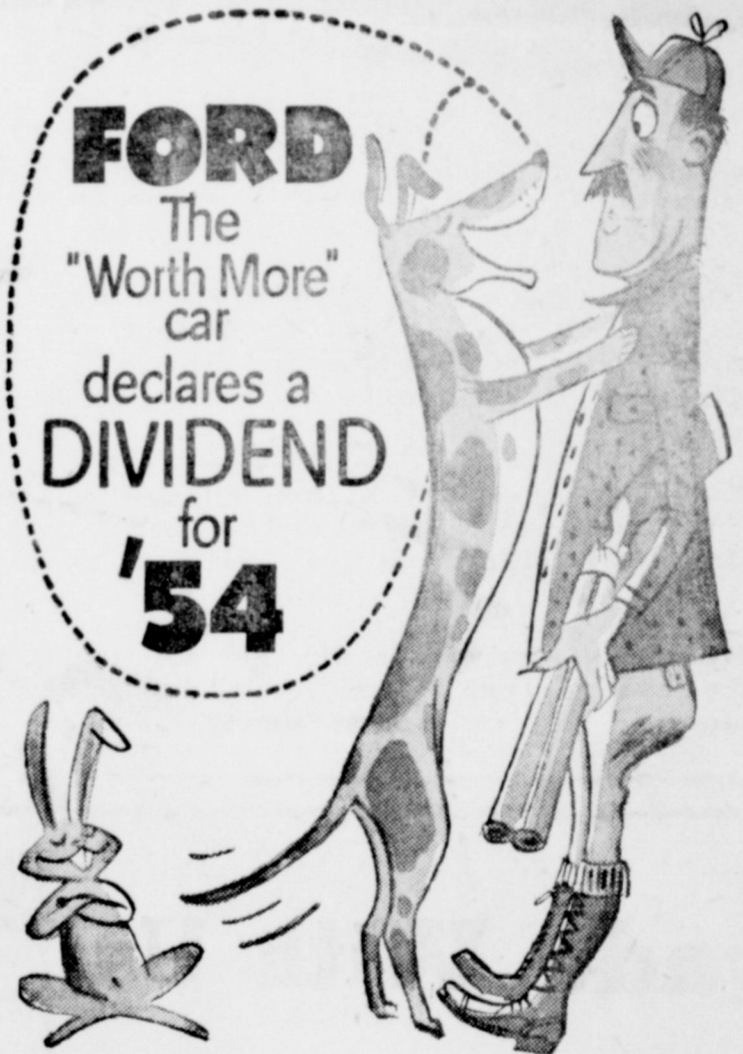
GARNISH

- 1/2 cup sliced green onion
- PREPARING THE FLUFFY WHITE RICE—To make 3 cups fluffy rice: Put 1 cup of uncooked rice, 2 cups of cold water and 1 teaspoon of salt in a two-

quart saucepan and cover with a tight-fitting lid. Bring to a vigorous boil. Then reduce the heat as low as possible and steam for 14 minutes or until all the water is absorbed, leaving the separate rice grains with their full nutritional value. This makes very firm rice grains. (If you prefer more tender rice grains, add 1/2 cup more water and increase the slow cooking time 4 or 5 minutes.) Remove the lid, permit the rice to steam dry to the desired consistency and the grains will be separate and fluffy. Never stir rice; lift gently with a fork.

METHOD: Brown almonds in 1 tablespoon oil. Set aside. With table fork, mash garlic into salt in skillet. (Be sure there is a tight-fitting cover, which can be used later.) Add 1 tablespoon oil, then add chicken. Brown lightly. Add 1 tablespoon oil and then bamboo shoots and mushrooms. Brown lightly. Add liquid, drained from canned bamboo shoots and water chestnuts. Cover tightly. Cook over low heat 5 minutes. Add water chestnuts, celery and 1/2 of the almonds. Just heat through. Celery and chestnuts should remain crisp. For gravy . . . shake up in small jar, cornstarch, salt, sugar, water and soy sauce. Stir into mixture. Cook until liquid thickens and is smooth. Sprinkle over dish, green onions and rest of almonds. Serve with hot fluffy cooked rice. This will serve 4.

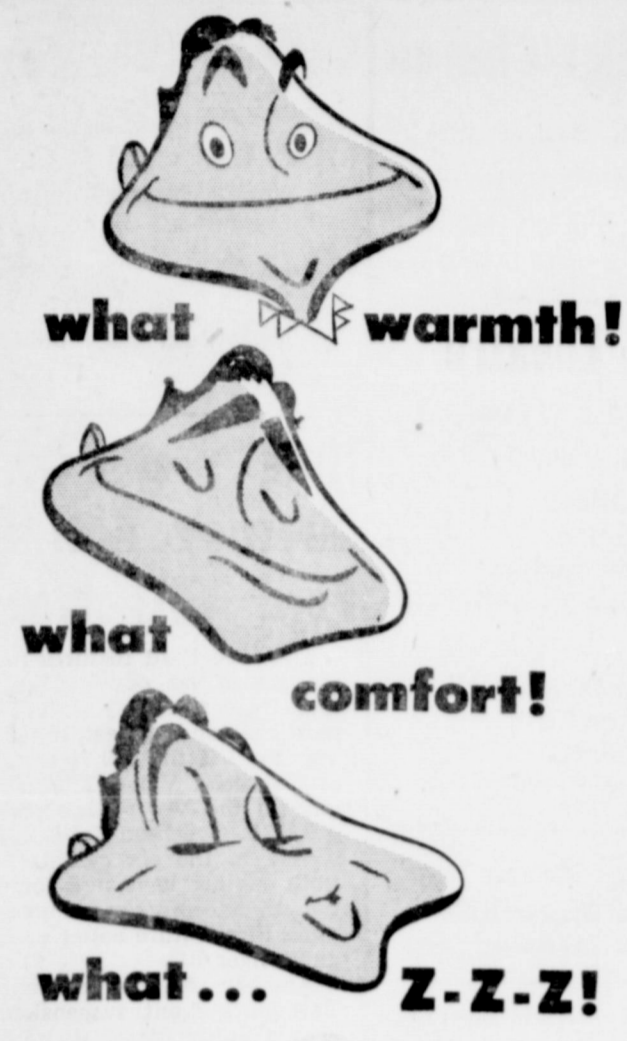

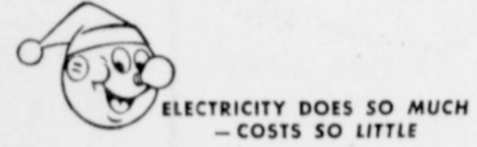

Hunters Need To Know More About Hunting License

AUSTIN, Dec. 26. — The Director of Law Enforcement for the Game and Fish Commission said wardens' arrest reports indicate that some Texans "are a little careless in NOT informing themselves about their hunting license requirements."
He said the latest tabulation shows 50 prosecutions for the lack of hunting licenses. Thirty-two of the hunters were residents and eighteen were non-residents.
The Law Enforcement Director said persons hunting small game out of their own home county must have licenses. Persons hunting big game everywhere except on the property upon which they reside must have licenses.

Wildlife Stamps Are Distributed

WASHINGTON, D. C.—Dec. 30.—The 17th annual Wildlife Conservation Stamps published by the National Wildlife Federation are now being distributed from Federation headquarters in Washington.

The 36 stamps in the 1954 edition include full-color illustrations of 14 species of North American birds, five mammals, five fishes, seven wild flowers and two trees, the red admiral butterfly, a timber rattlesnake and the Anderson tree frog.

They were painted by four noted nature artists. Roger Tory Peterson, the Federation's art director and best known for his illustrated "Field Guide to the Birds," contributed nine of the birds, ranging from the lordly Canada goose and the popular bobwhite to the colorful scarlet tanager. He also painted the butterfly and some of the wild flowers.

The five mammals—black bear, walrus, gray fox, wood rat and coati—were painted by Francis Lee Jaques, for many years staff artist of the American Museum of Natural History. Jaques also contributed the fishes, five of the birds and the trees.

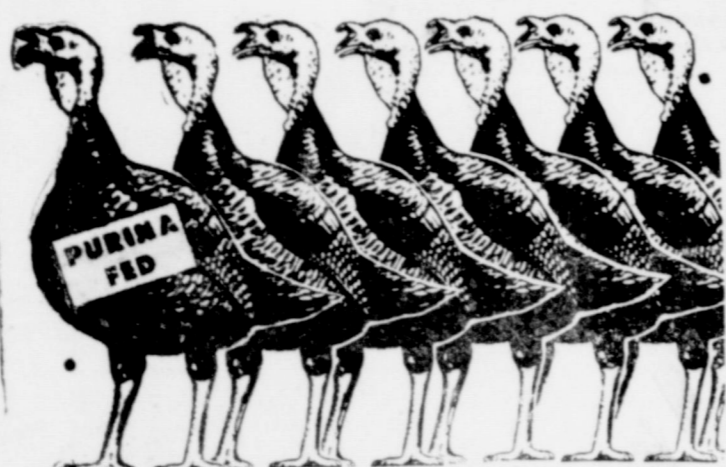

New Leon River Water Reservoir Nearing Finish

The Leon River dam, which will provide a water reservoir to serve the Cities of Eastland and Ranger, is approximately two-thirds complete, engineers reported Saturday. The dam is located some eight miles east of Eastland.

The dam is due to be completed about February 1, and construction work began about a year ago. The dam will cost around \$400,000 and the two cities voted \$1,500,000 in water bonds to finance the lake and pipelines to the towns.

The new lake will cover a road used by residents of the Staff Community, and residents of Eastland and Rangers recently asked the State Highway Department to build a new farm-to-market road in the community to replace the current road. The department has taken the matter under advisement.
