



But in these days the small far-Where Shall I Buy my in mer has no reasonable excuse for not crowding every acre he has, not only in producing large crops, but valuable crops, for the ultimate result is the number of dollars the crop will bring. For this purpose the farmer has a long list of fruits and vegetables to select from. An acre of cotton may yield twenty five or thirty dollars. An acre of many fruits and vegetables may easily sell for five times as much, with little if any more labor than is applied to the acre of cotton. An acre of corn, making 30 bushels, may sell for fifteen dollars, while an acre of tomatoes, or many other vegetables, can be sold for ten to twenty times as much. The only obstacle in the way of a system is lack of the special knowledge required, and that difficulty is being rapidly r moved by agricultural colleges farmer's institutes, and agricultural papers, books and bulk letins and other means of disseminating agricultural knowledge. Those who hold aloof from these modern and efficient means of education may content themselves with their surrounding and conditions, for they will never acquire the needed

knowledge spontaneously.
