While Mr Carnegie is contrib uting a liberal number of his surplus millions to purmins to establish a permanent home for peace at The Hagre, and the efforts of statesmen are being directed to
bringing about a condition the bringing about a condition that
will make war practically will make war practically an im. possiblity. Uncle Sam. through his war department officials, is s proposing to establish a target room in the kindergarten and eventually make every school boy in the nation an expert marksman. This is one of the developments of the Dick mili tia bill, passed by the last Con gress. The plan has been re commended by a board of army officers and it is understood Mr Root, the secrethry of war, most . həartily approves of it.

The board has also recom mended that gun clubs be es mended that gun clubs be es
tablished all over the country to be supplied with rifles and am munition by the government This is for the purpose of tating in men who do not wish to join the state militia. The plan proposes to issue the rifles and ammunition to the governors of the different states whenever proper requisition is made "for them. The same provision is made for schools and colleges with a sug gestion that rifle practice be made a part of the regular course of instruction at such in stitutions. The board also makes a strong recommendatio in favor of a regular appropria tion to enable the states apropra tion to enabes near statla to build rifle ranges near all the larger cities where regular target practice may be had by all men who wish to avail themselves of the opportunity to improve their marksmanship.
