Terrible floods have occurred during the past week at Topeka, Kansas City, Des Moines and other points in Iowa, Kansas and Missouri. The loss of life at Topeka was about 100. Fire broke out in portion of city cut off from aid by fire department and destroyed many lives and buildings. Water came up into the Union depot at Kansas City and injured much property especially the wholesale house in the vicinity. 600 persons were rendered homeless in Des Moines and 8000 homeless in Topeka. Last accounts state that water is receding and supplies were being sent in to relieve the suffering at Topeka. About 50 lives were lost at Kansas City, Kan. The buyers have made numerous complaints in past seasons of the way wheat is shocked and left in the field before being threshed. When the rains descended some years, they caused considerable loss to the wheat growers. Of course everybody cannot thresh at once, but if wheat is properly stacked there should be little damage on account of weather.

Vaseline Stains-Saturate the spot with ether and lay a cup over it to prevent evaporation until the stain is removed. Use the ether with very great care.

Chocolate and Cocoa Stains-Wash with soap in tepid water.




