

American Physical Type High.

It appears from the report of that a girl has no breach of the surgeon general of the United States army that the total who proposes on Sunday and number of candidates examined for enlistment was 45,218, and that of this number about twothirds, or 30,176, were accepted This is a large proportion when the fact is taken into account that the standard of excelence required is very high, none but physically perfect men being accepted. Of the 45,218 appli cants for inlistment, 42,183 were white men and 3,035 were negroes. Of the white men, 37,790 were accepted, and of the negroes, 2.386. Out of every 1,000 men accepted, 781.05 on theaverage were born in the United States, 64-76 in British territory, 42.25 in Germany and 8.69 in Sweden and Norway Of 18 American Indians examined. 14 were enlisted as scouts. It is interesting to note that during the year 736 native Malay were examined for enlist ment as Philippine sconts, and that of these all except 20 were accepted, showing a surprisingly high standard of physique among the Phillipinos.
