stalks．Last week the samemen were in Gonzales exhibiting pro－ ducts manufactured from the stalks and the exhibit included five grades of paper，from tissue to a heavy grade of soft printing paper－a material resembling
celluloid，smokeless powder composition，alcohol and a pack age of fertilizer－all valuable products．A meeting was held
