Vaccination For Hog Cholera Is Urged by Agency

AUSTIN, Ot. 21. — With mid-west swine risers again facing possible millin-dollar losses this fall from hogeholera, the American Foundaion for Animal Health urged farmers today to adopt proper vaccination mea-

"The fact tat there are now seven types o hog cholera vaccination whichhave been government approvd has confused many farmers" the Foundation said. "It would be a tragedy if this confusion interferred with having hogs vecinated for protection from the nation's number one hog killer

The choice d the proper type vaccination is important for maximum protection, officials said. Each rethod has certain advantages an disadvantages depending on the local situation.

Such factors as herd history, the presence of hog cholera in the past, general herd heals and other variable factors all enter into the choice of the proper vaccine. The Foundation pointed out also that vaccination at the be guarded against.

"Every farm and every herd a different problem," the Foundation said. a herd owner would be wise to leave the selection of the proper type of vaccing and the proper time to vaccinate to his veterinarian." The Foundation ursed all
