Twenty million anglers can't be wrong about the fun of fishing. But they sure can make mistakes about the best time to fish.

Here are some portents for a lucky day's catch that you can look for when planning to drive off to your favorite piscatorial retreat.

Fish bite best when they can see best. This means they feed more when the waters are clear, not muddy. The moon seems to affect the fish's appetite too. In fact, there's a saying, "Fish bite best when the moon is bright, and this is true both day and night," that many fishermen swear by.

A good off-shore breeze is another lucky omen. The ripple on the water hides you from the fish. Rough water, however will hide the bait from the fish.

Many anglers consult a barometer before setting forth on their sport. They stay in bed if the barometer is low, but jump out early and fast when it is high or rising.

Incidentally, the warmer the water, the deeper should be your plugs, spoons or spinners as the fish seek out the cooler levels.

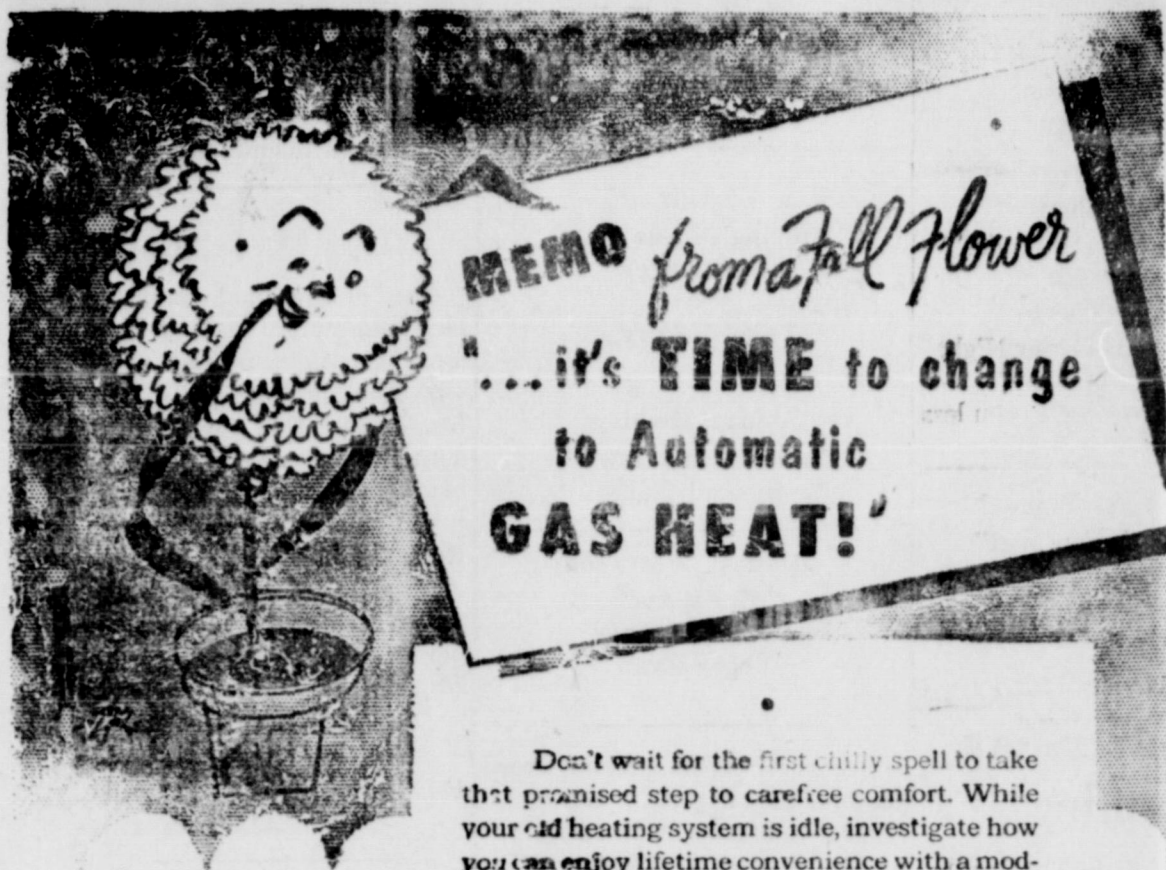

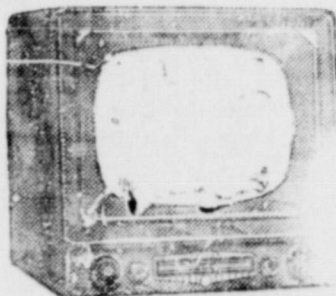

Vets Questions And Answers

Q — I am a Korean veteran. Would it be possible for me to enroll as an apprentice in a foreign country under the Korean GI Bill? I want to learn the watchmaking trade in Switzerland.

A — No. Training in foreign countries, under the Korean GI Bill, is limited only to VA-approved courses in accredited colleges and universities. The law prohibits all other forms of GI training outside the United States.

Q — I am learning to be an automobile mechanic as an on-the-job trainee under the Korean GI Bill. After I finish, would it be possible to get a GI business loan to open my own repair shop, even though I will have used up my entitlement to GI training?

A — Yes. The GI training and loan programs are separate benefits. The fact that you have used your training benefit in no way affects your rights to the GI loan benefit.

Q — I'm a Korean veteran, and I am totally disabled. I want to apply for the special GI insurance available to handicapped Korean veterans. What type of insurance can I get?

A — You may apply for five-year term insurance, ordinary life, twenty-payment life or thirty-payment life. Other permanent GI policies — the endowment plans — are not available to totally disabled veterans.

Q — Is it possible to get a GI loan to establish a business that I intend to run on a part-time basis?

A — Yes. It's not necessary that you spend your full time operating the business. But you will have to satisfy your lender that you probably can make a go of the business part-time.

Dry Weather May Limit Hunting

AUSTIN, Oct. 21. - The Executive Secretary of the Game and Fish Commission said the recent hunting season delay in Colorado from woods fire danger might serve as a reminder to Texans of the purpose of a new state law.

This law which was passed by the last Legislature authorizes closing of hunting seasons where the fire hazard is considered critical.

In Colorado the Game and Fish Commission, empowered in that state to administer this law, postponed opening of the big game hunting season because the wooded areas were too dry.

Many Texans were affected by the Colorado decree since they had planned vacations to conform to the October 15 opener on the western slope and the October 20 opener in eastern Colorado. The postponed seasons will begin October 24 and November 9.

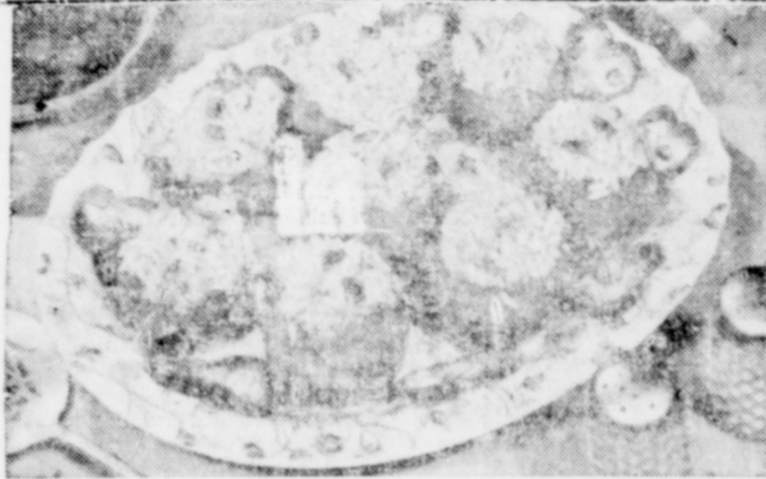

Curried Rice and Tuna Make a Tasty and Thrifty Filling for Luscious Tomatoes

Rice brings together the deep sea goodness of tuna fish and the Oriental excitement of curry in this versatile main dish. The curry powder contributes exotic flavor and intriguing color enhanced by the bits of green pepper and the brilliant red of the tomatoes.

Served piping hot from the oven or cold and refreshing on a bed of greens, this "something special" for the family is also something quick and easy for Mom to fix.

INGREDIENTS:
 8 medium sized ripe tomatoes
 4 tablespoons minced onion
 2 tablespoons minced green pepper
 4 tablespoons butter or margarine
 1 7-ounce can tuna fish
 2 cups cooked rice
 1 teaspoon curry powder
 1/4 teaspoon salt
 1/4 teaspoon pepper
 1/4 cup water

PREPARING THE FLUFFY WHITE RICE: To make 3 liberal cups of fluffy rice, put 1 cup of uncooked rice, 2 cups of cold water and 1 teaspoon of salt into a 2 quart saucepan and bring to a vigorous boil. Turn the heat as low as possible. Cover saucepan with a lid and leave for 15 minutes.

low heat for 14 minutes. Do not remove lid nor stir rice while it is cooking. Turn off the heat. Use exact measurements of uncooked rice and water. Time the cooking accurately.

For real convenience and economy of time and effort, keep unused rice in the refrigerator in a covered container at all times. Use it for many quick, delicious and inexpensive soups, salads, casserole dishes, hot breads and desserts.

METHOD: Peel tomatoes easily by scalding, plunging into cold water and then peeling. Slice off stem end of tomatoes. Carefully scoop out pulp. Cook onion and green pepper in the butter or margarine until tender. Add the tuna fish, rice, curry powder, salt, pepper and water. Mix thoroughly. Fill the tomatoes with the tuna and rice mixture and bake at 350° F. about 15 minutes or until the tomatoes are tender. Serve hot. Garnish with green pepper rings if desired.

For a cool and refreshing salad, chill the tomatoes after they are stuffed and serve on salad greens.

This recipe makes 8 servings or 3 cups of the curried tuna and rice mixture.
