



"Cotton is one of our plants that requires more labor than anything else that we raise.

It is generally planted when frost is over in the spring.

After it comes up it is ploughed and chopped sometimes four or five times.

It has to be kept clean of weeds and grass to make. 1 generally takes from five to six months to make.

Then we pick it. After we pick it we haul it to the gin and have it separated from the seed. The cotton is then wrapped in bagging and ties.

Then we put it on the market. It goes to the spinning, where they make all kinds of useful things, such as clothes, hats, saddle girts, linings, quilts, mattresses, collar-pads, ropes, stockings and all kinds of laces, belt-
