Annual 4-H Club Swine Show Will Be Held Sept. 26

The annual 4-H Club Swine Show will be held at the Rodeo Arena in Ranger on Saturday, September 26 at 10 a. m.

Waide Frey, Comanche County Agent, will judge the show, which will have eight registered duroc gilts entered. These gilts were awarded to the 4-Hers in May through a swine program sponsored by the Sears Foundation and the extension service.

The boys wrote essays on the advantages of raising swine and after interviews with the county agent and inspection of the farm, were awarded a registered duroc gilt. The boys are to breed the gilts and return the choicest gilt from the spring litter. The program has been progressing in Eastland County for many years.

This year's winners were Jimmy Robinson, Ranger; Earl Fonville and Jay Grimshaw, Desdemona; Jerry Warren, Gorman; Joe Paul May, Carbon; Gary Maynard, Rising Star; and Robert Bell and Phillip Harrelson, Nimrod.

The Sears Foundation is offering prizes of \$8, \$7, \$6, \$5, and \$4 to the five best gilts. All persons interested in good swine raising have been invited to attend as these pigs will rank with the best in the county.

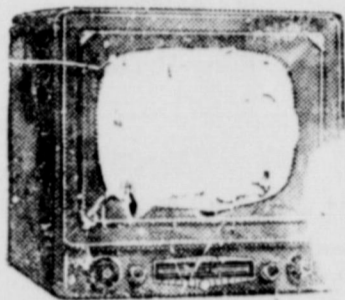

Deer Crop Good After Fall Rains

AUSTIN, Sept. 19. — Come-back of green stuff after the recent rains is benefiting wild deer in more ways than one, reports the Executive Secretary of the Game and Fish Commission.

He said growth of natural food, stimulated by the wet weather, is helping keep the herds from grass along the highways and thus reducing the toll from deer being struck by cars.

Game wardens had noted an unusually high accident rate during the late summer when pastures became short and the animals fed along the grassy shoulders.

"We lose many deer from being struck by cars regardless of the range conditions," said the Executive Secretary. "The crash rate is high at night when the animals are blinded by lights. But they are drifting away from the green shoulders now that pastures are coming back.

"However, deer roam around at night and the motorist can help reduce the crash rate by more careful driving in bag game areas."

Auto Inspection Stations Now Open

AUSTIN, Sept. 15 — Texas motorists found the doors of 2,120 official auto inspection stations open this morning ready to check their vehicles under the provisions of the modified Motor Vehicle Inspection Law which was enacted by the last Texas Legislature.

George Busby, Chief of the Texas Department of Public Safety's Motor Vehicle Inspection Division, announced that that number of stations have already been licensed to operate and that another two hundred applications are now on file from operators, desiring to conduct inspections. Busby estimated that the total number of inspection stations will reach 3,500 within the next few months.

The new period, during which motorists must have their cars inspected, opened today and will run through next April 15th.

Homer Garrison, Jr., Director of the Safety Department, has issued an appeal to car owners to take their vehicles to one of the convenient stations early and avoid a last-minute rush similar to that which resulted under the old law that expired August 25th.

Garrison pointed out that all of the station operators have been fully versed in the provisions of the new act which calls for inspection only of brakes, lighting equipment, horns, rear-view mirrors and windshield wipers.

Public Invited To Attend Livestock Meeting Nov. 9th

Anyone interested in livestock will be welcome to attend the five-county livestock pest control clinic to be held in Breckenridge on November 9. The meeting will start at 9:30 A. M. and will be held in the American Legion Hall in Breckenridge. The meeting is being sponsored by the Texas Association of Manufacturers and Distributors of Veterinary Supplies, and the West Texas Ranchers Association made up of members from Palo Pinto, Shackelford, Stephens, Eastland, and Callahan Counties.

Several nationally prominent authorities on measures for controlling livestock pests have been secured to appear on the program. Details are to be announced soon. Following the livestock pest control clinic the West Texas Ranchers Association will hold its election of officers.

Almond Chicken With Rice

Chinese Chicken Almond With Rice, a delightful delicately flavored dish with chicken, celery topping, is sure to please your family. It makes an attractive "one main dish type meal" and is easily served to a crowd.

Fresh or canned mushrooms may be used for making Chinese Almond Chicken.

- INGREDIENTS**
- 1 cup uncooked rice
 - 1 cup sliced mushrooms (canned or fresh)
 - 1 cup almonds — blanched
 - 3 tablespoons salad oil, to be used 1 tablespoon at a time
 - 1 clove garlic, cut in half
 - 1 teaspoon salt
 - 1 cup cubed bamboo shoots (canned)
 - 1 cup thinly sliced water chestnuts (canned)
 - 1 cup thinly sliced celery
 - 1 cup diced, cold chicken (fresh or canned)
 - 1 tablespoons liquid (1 tablespoon each, from bamboo shoots and water chestnut cans)

INGREDIENTS FOR GRAVY

- 2 teaspoons cornstarch
- 1 teaspoon sugar
- 4 tablespoons water
- 4 teaspoons soy sauce

GARNISH

- 1 cup sliced green onion

PREPARING THE FLUFFY WHITE RICE—To make 3 cups fluffy rice: Put 1 cup of uncooked rice, 2 cups of cold water and 1 teaspoon of salt in a two-

quart saucepan and cover with a tight-fitting lid. Bring to a vigorous boil. Then reduce the heat as low as possible and steam for 14 minutes or until all the water is absorbed, leaving the separate rice grains with their full nutritional value. This makes very firm rice grains. (If you prefer more tender rice grains, add 1/2 cup more water and increase the slow cooking time 4 or 5 minutes.) Remove the lid, permit the rice to steam dry to the desired consistency and the grains will be separate and fluffy. Never stir rice; lift gently with a fork.

METHOD: Brown almonds in 1 tablespoon oil. Set aside. With table fork, mash garlic into salt in skillet. (Be sure there is a tight-fitting cover, which can be used later.) Add 1 tablespoon oil, then add chicken. Brown lightly. Add 1 tablespoon oil and then bamboo shoots and mushrooms. Brown lightly. Add liquid, drained from canned bamboo shoots and water chestnuts. Cover tightly. Cook over low heat 5 minutes. Add water chestnuts, celery and 1/2 of the almonds. Just heat through. Celery and chestnuts should remain crisp. For gravy... shake up in small jar, cornstarch, salt, sugar, water and soy sauce. Stir into mixture. Cook until liquid thickens and is smooth. Sprinkle over dish, green onions and rest of almonds. Serve with hot fluffy cooked rice. This will serve 4.
