## San Angelo, Texas; Nov. 5. -

 Reports brought here by differ ent travelers through the section of country southwest of San Angelo, report great numbers of the differeat species of deer to be dying from a disease styled black tongue. The death rate is alarming, and from present indications there will be but few black tai deer in West Texas by the first of the year, unless the fatality of the contagious malady desists. One ranchman says he found seven sleek deer dead in his pasture, and several other like reports have been heard. Venison is rare food now, even in districts where deer have here to-fore been plentiful. Ranchmen are afraid to kill what fat, healthy looking bucks and does that they come upon, not knowing but what these animais are ing but what these animais are

other, indorsed Mr. Mayfield's motion as being willing to set it down for a hearing.
