question could be asked. It is a fact, however a most lamentable fact that Texas lags behind nearly, if not all, her sister States in the amount of her dairy products. In no section of the United industry be eaiser carried on than in this greatest State in area and resources generally of the whole Southwest. All the year round milch cows can run at large on pasture, procuring at least half if not two-thirds their forage for themselves. The climate is well adapted to the production of
butter and cheese, and if it is

thing not done? "Oh, we are a new State," says one. "We
