Up to last Friday there had been weighed at the two cotton yards in Ballinger considerably over 30,000 bales of cotton and the stuff is still pouring in. There is much yet to be picked in the county and there will be in all likelihood 10000 more bales to come in. Already the amount brought is estimated to be worth over \$1,500,000.
