### Cattle Are Dying.

John Dorian returned last night from an extended trip out west and over the Devil's River country. Mr. Dorian left Brownwood eight weeks ago and the reports he gives of the country along the Devil's River are unusual. He says that the ground is almost absolutely barren of any kind of vegetation and that many of the Live Oak trees have not leafed out this year. It has been so long since a good rain fell that everything is in a deplorable condition. Mr. Dorian says one ranchman informed him that he had skinned more than nine hundred head of cattle, which had died from starvation.

The sheepmen killed most of the spring crop of lambs in order to allow the ewes to live. 
