took it away from her. The sheriff was telephoned for, bu before he could place her under arrest she had taken a dose of
morphine and died in a few minutes. Letters found in her room indicated that she spent the entire morning in preparation for death. It was evidently her intention to kill Sampson and then take poison.
She was buried in the Odd Fellows cemetery at Sweetwater.
