

Losy Rice and Cherry Pie With Coconut Crust is a New Idea for Heavenly Eating

The is a pie to remember! It is pood you won't be able to correct it. The rice and cherry ling is tinted a luscious red. The sweet and chewy coconut grust turns a golden brown as it bakes in the oven. As a fitting halo for this rice dessert, which halo for this rice dessert, which is positively out of this world, clouds of fluffy whipped cream wirl over the luscious rice and cherry filling.

The family can enjoy this sump-tuous pie all the time because the rice and cherry filling cooks

the rice and cherry filling cooks in a hurry and the coconut crust takes only seconds of attention before the oven takes over. The three magnificently good parts of this pie — the coconut grust — the rice and cherry fill-ing — the whipped cream top-ping — combine to make one of the year's most talked about pies.

INGREDIENTS

tablespoons soft butter or margarine
5 oz. package or can of moist coconut (1½ cups)
c cups cooked rice

eggs

% cup beet or cane suger 1½ cups canned tart, red cher-ries, drained

Red food coloring, if desired 1 cup whipping cream, chilled 14 teaspoon vanilla 14 cup beet or cane sugar

A cup beet or cane sugar PREPARING THE FLUFFY WHITE RICE: To make 3 lib-eral cups of fluffy rice, put 1 cup of uncooked rice, 2 cups of cold water and 1 teapcon of salt into a 2-quart saucepan and bring to a viscorous boll. Turn the beat as low as possible. Cov-Casuescen with a lid and lawy

over this low heat for 14 min-utes. Turn off the heat. Do not remove lid nor stir rice while it is cooking. After rice has cooked, remove saucepan from heat - but keep the lid on until you are ready to use the rice. Use exact measurements of un-

cooked rice and water. Time the cooking accurately.

For real convenience and economy of time and effort, keep unused rice in the refrigerator in covered container at all times. Die it for many quick, delicious and inexpensive soups, salads, casserole dishes, hot breads and desserts.

METHOD: To make the coconut crust, spread butter or margarine evenly over an 8 or 9 inch pie pan. Sprinkle the coconut into the pan and press into the but-ter. It helps to use a moist tea-spoon to press the coconut against the pan. Bake in a 350° oven until crisp and golden brown. To make the rice and cherry fill-

ing, mix together the rice, eggs, sugar and cherries and cook over a low heat, stirring conover a low heat, stirring con-stantly, until the mixture thick-ens. The egg whites make the mixture foamy, but soon cook into the rice. If desired, add red food coloring. This makes a more delicious looking filling. Pour the filling into the coconut crust. Cover with wax paper or aluminum foil and chill in the restrigerator.

refrigerator. To serve, whip the cream and fold in the vanilla and sugar. Spread over the rice and cherry filling.

He said the response to the state's season on ducks and geese, running from November 6 through January 4, has been favorable. The fact the season extends through the Christmas holidays has pleased gunners on the Gulf coast.


The Executive Secretary said north Texas hunters understandably were disappointed again at not being zoned like the mourning dove upper state shoot. He said prospects of a late flight from the north as reported in Washington should help compensate for the difference.

The United States Fish and Wildlife Service, which has final authority over seasons for migratory waterfowl, generally followed the request by the Game and Fish Commission for a sixty-day season, a limit of five and ten for ducks and a limit of five for geese.

The Executive Secretary said the barring of baiting for waterfowl will not affect many Texas hunters since the practice has not been widely followed in this State

The extra hour tagged to the day's shooting period, extending legal gunning to sunset, will have no appreciable affect, he said. "Waterfowl are too smart," he explained. "It will be rough on them for the first few days but they soon catch on. After they get wise, they simply won't move around much until after the shooting stops. In this case, the ducks and geese simply will have to delay moving into feeding grounds and back up their supper another hour."






