Funeral rites for E. J. Allen, 68, long-time resident of Eastland County, were conducted Tuesday at 2:30 p. m. from the Eastland Church of Christ with Bro. Austin Verner officiating.

Interment was in Coriath cemetery west of Eastland with Killingsworth Funeral Home, Ranger, in charge of arrangements. Pallbearers were Ed Harper, Truman Harper, J. H. Greer, Tom L. Fox, Harles Gardenhire and Jim Everett.

Mr. Allen died Monday in a Ranger hospital following a long illness.

Born in Burnett County, Texas December 5, 1884, the deceased lived in and around Carbon for a number of years before moving to Olden 27 years ago where he was employed as an automobile salesman prior to his illness.

Survivors include his widow, the former Miss Sally Andrews, whom he married at Carbon on May 22, 1910. Also two sons, O. L. Allen of Fremont, and W. E. Allen of Kermit; one daughter, Mrs. J. Seaborn of Cisco; one half-brother, Harvey, of Vandenberg; one sister, Mrs. Jennie Lemmons of Brady and four grandchildren.

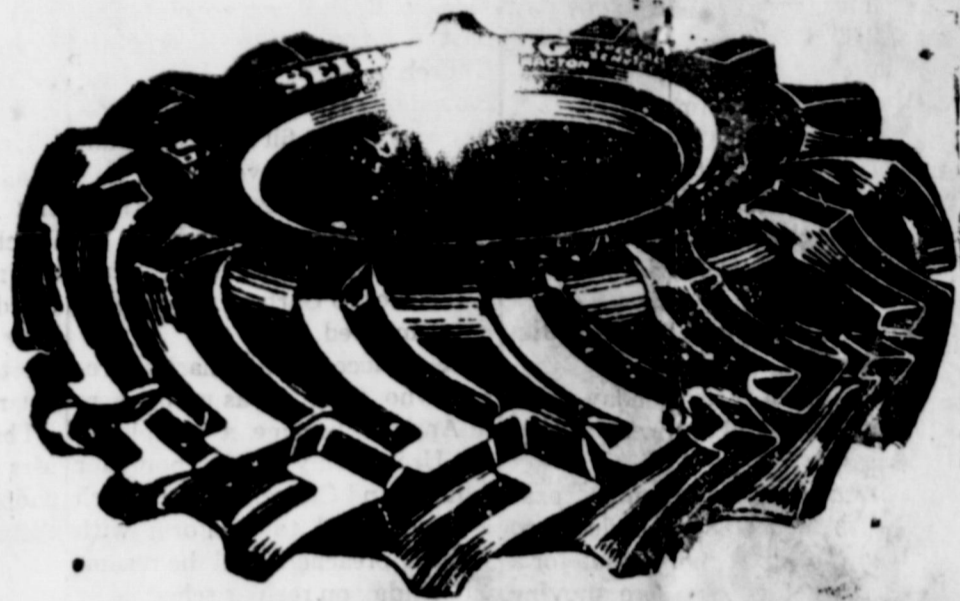

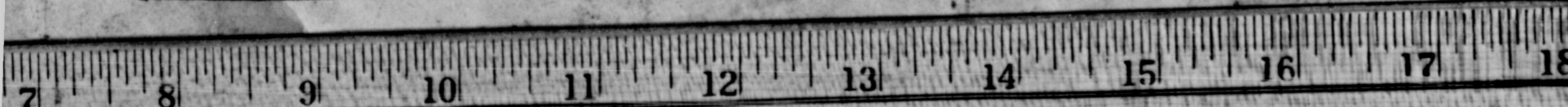
