"Hardin-Simmons University sponsors Senior Day each year in order to acquaint graduating high school students with life on a college campus," Dean W. C. Riddle, faculty chairman of the program, stated. "Special entertainment has been planned for the campus visitors and all training and recreational facilities of the university will be open for inspection."

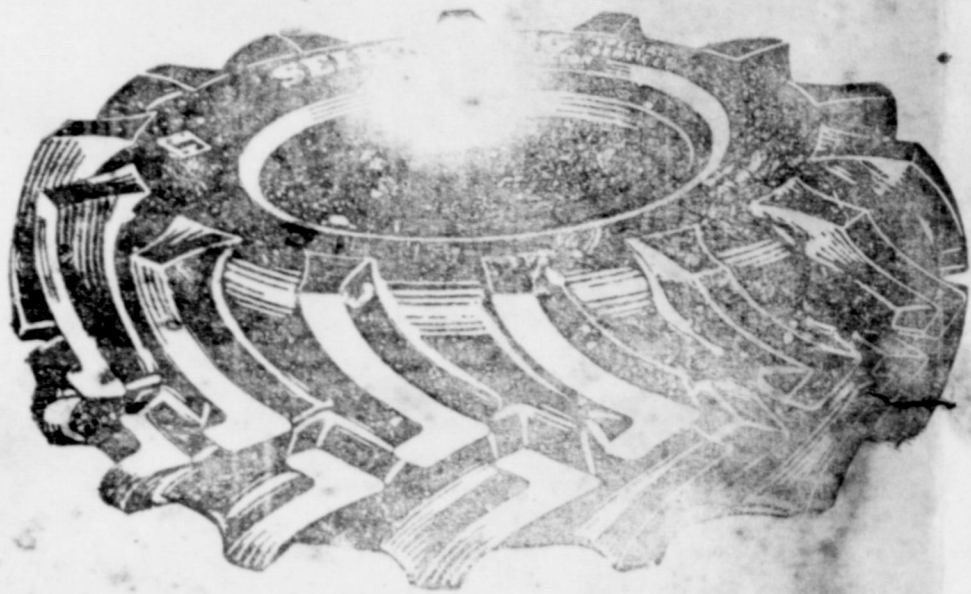
