 afterwards on the 23rd day of
 July, 1949, the defendants un-
 lawfully entered upon and dis-
 possessed it of such premises and
 withhold from him the possession
 thereof.

As is more fully shown by Plain-
 tiff's Petition on file in this suit.

If this citation is not served
 within ninety days after the date
 of its issuance, it shall be returned
 unserved.

The officer executing this writ
 shall promptly serve the same ac-
 cording to requirements of law,
 and the mandates hereof, and
 make due return as the law di-
 rects.
