News In Brief

Schools Close For Thanksgiving

The Carbon School will be closed on Thursday and Friday of this week in observance of Thanksgiving, according to an announcement by Superintendent T. E. Robertson. It is the usual custom for the schools to close at this time in order for the faculty and students to have the holidays off.

Also most of the business houses in town will be closed with the exception possibly of some service stations.

Large Crowd Attends Hearing

Around 25 citizens, headed by Mayor Ike Butler, attended the hearing held at the court house in Eastland last Thursday on the closing of the local MK&T railroad station. The meeting was held by a representative of the Railroad Commission. Several witnesses from Carbon took the stand and protested the closing of the depot.

The Railroad Commission will give their report by January 1st as to whether or not the station will be allowed to remain open.

Peanut Butter Bait

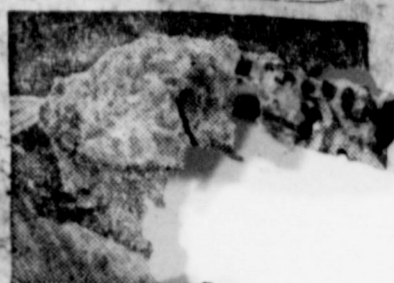

Hanging Rayons

When hanging rayons other than dresses and blouses, use no clothespins. Hang over the line or on hangers. Always hang rayons in the shade—not the sun. Rolling in a heavy towel is often sufficient preparation for ironing.

Frozen Lemon Pie Is Toothsome Dish

FROZEN lemon pie is a toothsome dinner dessert for the family that's been working hard all day, says the Country Cooking editor of Capper's Farmer.

Graham cracker crumbs are crust and topping for the chilled yellow filling, she writes in the nationally circulated farm magazine. Pie-shaped pieces are made by cutting diagonally across the refrigerator tray in which pie is frozen.

The dessert which will be an ever-popular family favorite, serves 8, the Capper's Farmer expert advises.



FROZEN LEMON PIE
2 eggs, separated 1 c. evaporated milk, whipped
1/2 c. lemon juice 1/2 c. graham cracker crumbs
1/2 c. sugar

Beat egg yolks; add lemon juice and piece of rind sliced from lemon and all but 2 tablespoons of the sugar. Cook over low heat 15 minutes, stirring constantly. Remove rind and cool. Beat egg whites until stiff; add remaining sugar and fold into cooked mixture. Add whipped evaporated milk. Line refrigerator tray with waxed paper. Sprinkle with 1/4 cup of the crumbs. Pour in lemon mixture; sprinkle with remaining crumbs. Freeze with temperature set at coldest. Serves 8.

International Uniform Sunday School Lessons BY DR. KENNETH J. FOREMAN

Why We Worship

Lesson for November 25, 1951

FEWER than two out of every three Americans belong to any church or synagogue. Yet the traveler across America is never long out of sight of some house of worship. With or without a cross, with or without paint, every few miles there will be a church or chapel or meeting-house, where like-minded people meet to worship the One God.

Variety It is amazing, the confusing variety of ways in which God is publicly worshipped. Some churches are liturgical; that is, the form of the service is prescribed, printed in a book, used with little change from generation to generation. Roman Catholic churches are of this kind (though there is a wide range of detail in the procedures of different Catholic churches); so are the Lutheran, the Reformed and the Episcopal churches, among others.

Other churches are non-liturgical, or free, in their mode of worship, varying all the way from churches with optional forms of worship on out to sects like the "Church of God with Signs Following."

The liturgical churches, too, are different as can be. Some liturgies are filled with chanting, incense, long and not easy for a stranger to follow. Other liturgies are brief and simple. The interiors of these various kinds of churches are just as different as the interiors of hotels—all the way from the elegant Waldorf-Astoria down to the ramshackle boarding house of a frontier town.

The "man from Mars" would be so bewildered by all this that he would ask: Is there anything at all that these different kinds of worship have in common?

Communion

FOR an answer, we can go back more than 3,000 years to the time when Moses was organizing his people's worship as he organized the rest of their lives. You would hardly have recognized that little "tabernacle" in the wilderness as a place of worship at all; it looked like neither church nor synagogue.

And what went on in the tabernacle would look strange to a Jew of today, stranger still to a Roman Catholic, stranger of all to a "non-liturgical" Protestant. And yet, what went on to make that tabernacle possible in the first place, and what went on in it afterwards, give us the answer to the question: What do all the innumerable forms of worship have in common?

First of all is communion with God. In true worship we become aware of Him; in the New Testament phrase, we "approach with boldness the throne of Grace."

Not every one reaches this divine awareness in the same way.

Consecration

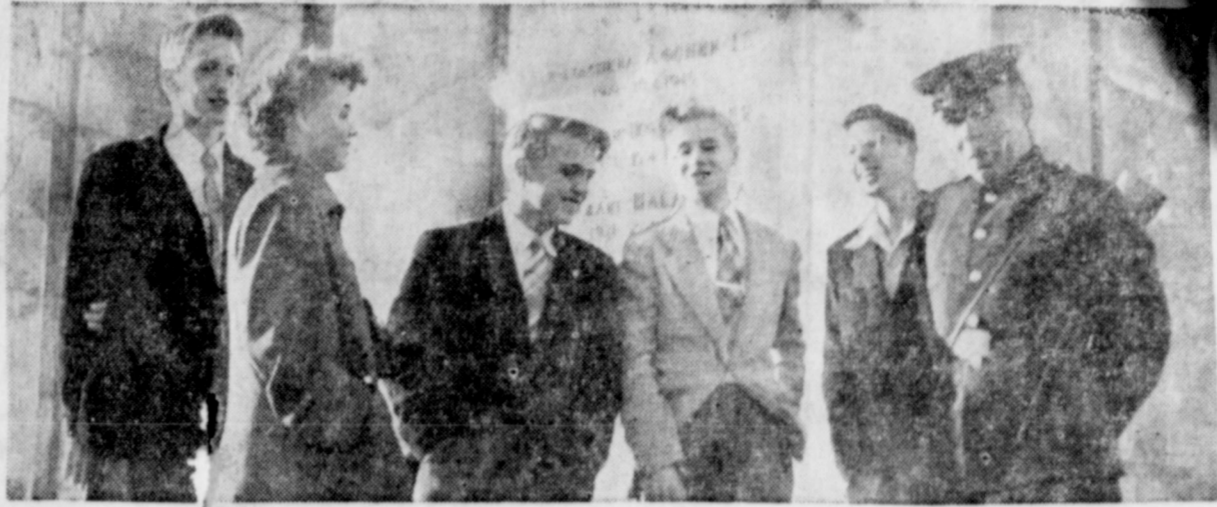
BUT there is another side to worship: Consecration. However varied the order of worship may be, one part of it will be found nearly everywhere: the offering.

This is actually one of the most important parts of the service, though it is often neglected and "skimmed." For the offering is not only important in itself, but it is a great symbol of what worship ought always to be, a call to dedication.

Into the offering plate go bits of silver, green paper, checks . . . money? Yes, and more. This represents something of the life and work of the worshippers. Every man has some better moments when he would generously like to do something to help the world. On Sunday the church harnesses his vague good will. It gives him a channel for his generosity.

What a man gives ought never to be TO the church but THROUGH the church; it would be an expression of gratitude to God.

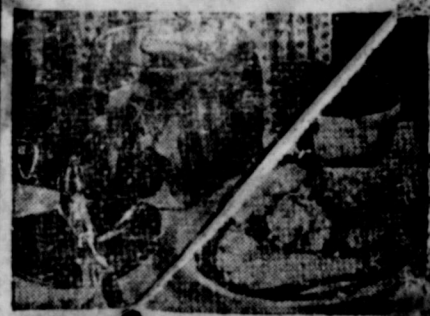

Pressure Saucepan
 ● Saves Time and Fuel

IN A comparatively short time the pressure saucepan has won an assured place in farm kitchens, according to Laura Dailey, in an article in Capper's Farmer, one of the best known farm magazines. It saves time and fuel. Many different foods may be prepared in a pressure saucepan. It is particularly good for those which need long cooking. "Pressure cooking," Miss



Dailey says, "preserves food with color and flavor." A few rules of operation are important:

- 1.—Never fill the pan more than two-thirds full.
- 2.—Be sure that steam flows steadily from vent before you close it.
- 3.—Wait until weight or pressure control jiggles or hisses or cooking indicator is at right position in your directions before you start counting time. Then reduce the heat and let cook for specified time.
- 4.—Reduce the pressure as each recipe indicates.
- 5.—After pressure is reduced, be certain to remove the weight, or lift the pressure control, before removing cover.

Some farm women are doing a limited amount of canning in their pressure saucepans, Miss Dailey points out.
