Raiders ready for No. 5 Cornhuskers

The No. 17 Texas Tech volleyball team will return to action tonight competing in the Cornhusker Challenge in Lincoln, Neb.

The Red Raiders are coming off a four-game win over Southwest Conference rival Baylor on Wednesday.

"They played hard and it was a good effort," coach Mike Jones said of the Baylor match in a phone interview from Lincoln Thursday night. "We had a lot of enthusiasm and that is one thing we have been lacking the last few matches."

Tech opens the tournament at 7:30 p.m. today against the No. 5 Nebraska Cornhuskers, and Jones said he is happy to be playing a team of Nebraska's caliber.

Tech enters the match with a record of 18-3 and 6-3 in the SWC, while Nebraska is 15-2 and ranked No. 5 in the latest AVCA/Tachikara coaches poll.

"They are always a very good team and they are well coached," Jones said. "Our ball control and defense has to be good. We have to get our hands on the ball with our blockers."

Last season the Raiders took the No. 5 Cornhuskers to five games at the Kentucky Tournament and Jones said the team must do the same thing to compete with Nebraska.

"They don't lose very often on their home court," he said. "It is a good place to see how we can compete against a team of this caliber."

Jones said junior middle blocker Erica Ruegg, who did not play against Texas-Arlington last Saturday because of a shoulder injury, is ready to play this match.

"I think she is starting to realize that her presence on the court is important to the team," he said. "Any team in any sport has a go-to person, and she is that person."

Against the Bears, Ruegg had 13 kills with four solo blocks and hit .250 for the match.

Tech will face Wichita State Saturday at 1 p.m. due to the Nebraska-Kansas football game. The match was originally scheduled for 5:30 p.m. Saturday.

Rice's Emanuel happy with return to Houston

The road from Houston to Los Angeles is a long one, but for Bert Emanuel that road led him back to his native Houston.



Emanuel is the new gear in the 1992 Rice Owl offense. Emanuel has added an extra punch to an offense looking for something to take pressure off 1991 Doak Walker award winner Trevor Cobb. "It's great to be in the same backfield with him," Emanuel said in a phone interview Thursday. "Rice is only 30 miles away from home and sometimes you get a little homesick."

Emanuel left the Bruins in 1990 after lettering one year for coach Terry Donahue, but this season he has seemed to grasp the new offense.

"I think the first couple of games was a big test," he said. "I'm starting to settle down a little bit and I can feel it coming around."

This season Emanuel has averaged 79.4 yards rushing in the five games he has played this season, gaining 459 yards on the ground for the season.

The Owls suffered close losses to Duke and Air Force but one game that Emanuel said he thinks they could have won was the one against Texas.

"We thought that we were going to win that game, but I just think we ran out of time," he said.

The Owls have had two weeks to prepare for the Raiders after a win over Texas Christian two weeks ago. In Rice's 28-13 win over Southern Methodist on Oct. 10, Emanuel and Cobb combined for 319 yards, with Cobb having 210 yards and Emanuel accounting for 109.

He said he is expecting nothing surprising from Texas Tech on Saturday.

"They show a lot of man coverage, but there won't be anything that we haven't seen before," Emanuel said.

Tech looking to stop Cobb, Emanuel combo

This season, the Rice Owls think they can turn things around with the addition of new quarterback Bert Emanuel along with 1991 Doak Walker award winner, Trevor Cobb.

"Rice is just that much better this year," senior line-backer Mike Liscio said of Emanuel. "In fact, I think that he (Emanuel) is more of a threat than Cobb is, because he can pass and run with the ball."

Liscio and the rest of the Raiders will take on the Owls Saturday at 2 p.m. in Rice Stadium in Houston. The Owls are 3-4 and 2-2 in Southwest Conference play, while the Raiders are 3-5 and 2-2 in league play.

Last year in Lubbock, the Raiders beat Rice 40-20. In that game, Tech set a school record with the average yardage per play going for 8.36 yards. Also in that game, quarterback Robert Hall passed for 366 yards and rushed for 87.

"I think that the big difference between that game last year and this game is Emanuel," coach Spike Dykes said. "He adds a different dimension to their offense."

Emanuel is a 5-foot-11-inch junior transfer from the UCLA. The Houston native was a one-time letterman for the Bruins. However, the former star quarterback out of Langham Creek High School saw little action in his two

years with the Bruins.

Now with his addition to the Rice offense, Tech defenders have more to worry about than in years past.

"I definitely think that they have two weapons this year," junior defensive end Shawn Jackson said.

"I think that he's a much better runner than he is a passer."

Dykes is a little more concerned about Emanuel's "big play potential."

"He is just super fast," Dykes said. "He's probably one of the fastest runners in the Southwest Conference."

Fred Goldsmith's Rice offense runs more of an option offense than in years past, Dykes explained. In order to stop Cobb and Emanuel, Dykes is thinking about placing a "spy" on Emanuel.

"Cobb is a prolific runner and Emanuel is one of those 'keepers' when he runs. He might be running the ball and you think he's going to pitch it out, but then he keeps it and makes the big gain," Dykes explained.

Liscio said the defense might also drop back two of their linemen and have the nose tackle rush the passer.

"If we do something like that, then we'll have some guys back there that can contain him (Emanuel). And with Shawn (Banks), he can also help out and cover or rush the passer," he said.

On defense, Rice runs an experienced group, led by 1991 all-SWC first team defensive tackle Matt Sign. Sign, a nose tackle for the Owls, has led the defensive linemen in tackles the past three years and has accumulated 191 career tackles.

"They have an explosive offense, but their defense is very strong," Dykes said. "Rice is a very hard team to run against."

"It'll be tough playing in front of nobody," Jackson said.

Coaches and players know Tech stands a very small chance of reaching a bowl game.

But if the Raiders can win this game and their last two (at Texas Christian and Houston), then they can pull off a winning record.

"We're down a little right now," Jackson added. "But we'll come back."
