Premier Refining Company Starts New Project

Officials of Premier Oil Refining Co. of Texas participate in ground breaking ceremonies recently at their Fort Worth refinery, site of the new Platforming process which is expected to be completed and in operation shortly after the first of the year.

R. P. Hargis, president of Premier, together with L. G. Duffillo, general supt. of Premier refining operations, who will supervise the construction work, N. Y. Jones, administrative refinery supt. at Arp, J. E. Fullock, administrative refinery supt. at Faird, Lawrence Connelley, refinery supt. at Fort Worth, and Elmer Smith, supt. of Premier's Longview refinery were on hand to remove the first few scoopsful of earth which signals the beginning of construction on the Platformer.
