16th County Pecan School To Be April 18th In Cisco

The 16th Annual Eastland County Pecan Budding a n d Grafting School will be held at Cisco, April 18, according to an announcement today by DeMarquis Gordon, Eastland County Agricultural Agent.

The school will be co-sponsored by the Eastland County Fecan Growers Association and and the Cisco Chamber of Commerce. The morning session of the school will begin at 9:30 a.m. in the new auditorium of Cisco Junior College. This session will be devoted to discussions, pictures and demonstrations on budd-

ing and grafting. After lunch, the afternoon session will be held at a local pecan orchard near Cisco. Field demonstrations will be given and everyone will have

opportunity to practice the itch budding and inlay graf-

Dr. J. W. Worthington, Tex-A&M Extension Service Horticulturist, will be the instructor. Pecan producers and county agent will assist with the demonstrations.

Anton White, President of the Eastland County Pecan Growers Assn., said the associstion will have bud wood, graft wood, as well as budding and grafting supplies for sale. grafting wood of most of the new USDA varieties.


