Only Few Days Left To Pay Poll Tax

With only a few days remaining to pay poll tax and become eligible to vote in this year's election, Neil Day, Tax Assessor & Collector of Eastland County, states that he has visited his sub-stations at Cisco, Ranger, Gorman and Rising Star and finds that poll tax payments are lagging far behind what they should be at this time of year.

In election years, Eastland County has a potential vote of approximately 7,000 to 7,500 and to date with all poll tax sub-stations reporting, less than 2,500 poll tax have been paid in the county.

Poll tax are not assessed with the property tax and the statement of taxes sent out by the tax office does not include poll tax, but it is necessary that the poll tax be paid to be eligible to vote. Mr. Day urges those who have paid their property tax to check their receipts to see if they have paid their poll tax when the other taxes were paid.

THE BIBLE SPEAKS
By DR. KENNETH J. FOREMAN
Scripture, Acts 16:11-12
Devotional Reading: Romans 3: 21-26.

Unto Men
Lesson for May 29, 1950

"Men are not Christians because they believe in Jesus Christ." The command was given to all nations, baptizing them... teaching them... (Matt. 28:19, 20). Do you know some one in the church who says he doesn't believe in missions? Such a man does not take Christ seriously. If you do believe in Christ, then his commands are for you, not to ignore.

When Men Obey
UP TO NOW, the church has been playing around with Jesus' command. Very few denominations are actually putting any large amount of money or manpower into obeying Christ's command to go into all the world.

One fairly typical American denomination contained last year to all benevolences, that is to all causes not in their own local congregations, the sum of \$9,137,065. That sounds like a lot, but divided by the total number of members it boils down to \$14.63 per member for the year, or less than five cents a day.

And of course not all that big sum of five cents went to missions of any sort. Yet that denomination gives more per capita to missions than most others do. When a man who gives less than five cents a day to carry the good news of the Kingdom into the world, sings "Onward, Christian Soldiers" or prays "Thy Kingdom come" he has made what he mean it? Not a nickel's worth!

Or take the question of man-power. The same denomination sends out as missionaries, every year, as many men and women as are sent by some denominations three times its size. And yet, even so, the total number of ordained ministers in that denomination who are foreign missionaries is only 4 per cent of their total number of ministers.

AS A MATTER OF FACT, even the earliest church was slow to pay real attention to Christ's command, "Forward! Men are strange creatures. And one of the strange things about us is that we often have to be scared into doing it. It took the persecution set off by the death of Stephen to move the Christians in Jerusalem out along the road to the north, east, anywhere to get away from the city of death. Everywhere they went, they told the story of Jesus.

But at first it was all rather breathless and informal. "Why are you here?" one of these DP's would be asked, as he was passing through Samaria or Antioch or Alexandria, perhaps in the bread-line, perhaps looking for a place to work and settle down. "I'm a refugee from Jerusalem and he would say, "But why?" "Well, I'm a Christian." "What's that?"

Unto All Men
ONE OF THE MOST interesting and exciting little books of recent years is called "They Found the Church There," by H. P. Van Dusen. It is the dramatic story of the American GI, to his great astonishment, found Christians in the most unexpected places.

It is a tremendous mistake to think that the Christian religion is only for English-speaking peoples, or for Europeans, or for white people. Christ can be as much at home in an American farmhouse or in an apartment on the city boulevard. He comes to all men, and as Peter found out, the Lord is no respecter of persons.

NEW CHICKENS TAKE ALL TOP HONORS IN TEXAS LAYING TEST

STEPHENVILLE, Tex.—(Spl.)—Hy-Lines, a new kind of chicken bred like hybrid corn, ran away with all top honors in the 20th Annual Texas Egg Laying Test conducted by Tarleton State College here.

Hy-Line pens had six of the top 10 places, rabbit first, second, third, fourth, sixth and tenth.

Each pen entered in the test consisted of 13 birds. In this year's test, just completed, there were 87 pens entered by 46 leading breeders from 20 states.

Average 288.5 Eggs
The top Hy-Line pen laid a total of 3751 eggs, or an average of 288.5 eggs per hen during the year.
