They began to break on the top and we gathered up our blanket rolls and went to the after deck, what was used for the mess hall. This was about dark and several of the boys were feeding much supper as I was afraid of | so bad that I had to stay on the other man's watch. It began to look gloomy to me. Our lieutenant came out and asked me how I was making it. I said I there, and the rifles. I ask him what he thought about it. He said it is hell. He seemed as much excited as I did. I began to study how to pray. About $3: 30$ fire broke out on the after deck. It was raining pretty hard and wondered what in the world was back there that could burn and it raining so hard. A wave washed up high enough to strike a life buoy and it had chemical that would ignite when water struck it. Well, they put it out in a few minutes, but while fighting it one man got his leg broke.
