Voice of Barrientos to Be Heard on Columbia Records

- Maria Barrientos who was the one big sensation of the Metropolitan Opera season of 1915-16, has signed a contract to make voicerecordings exclusively for the Columbia Graphone Company, and has already made three splendid recordings that show her marvelous soprano at its best.

Mme. Barriento's first recordings, so significant in the world of music, include her great triumphs, the famous "Mad Scene" and the first act aria "Silence O'er All" from "Lucia," and a miraculous bit of coloratura work, the "Valse" from Gounod's "Mireille." These recordings are issued in the January Columbia record list coincidently with another recording by Lazaro, acclaimed as the greatest tenor of the age: "Spirto Gentil," from "La Fa-

This most notable record announcement also includes recordings by Kathleen Parlow, who plays the immortal "Last Rose of Summer;" by Godowsky who renders Liszt's "Paraphrase on Rigeletto;" by Lucy Gates, who sings two coloratura gems; and by Verwho is introduced with "The Sunshine of Your Smile." Two operatic overtures, some Spanish light music, and two popular Grieg compositions are added by Prince's orchestra to a truly brilliant orchestral list.

The list is a "headliner" list all through, from the operatic to the popular end. The part classified as "popular" is led by Al Johson, probably the best-known comedian on the American stage, who sings "Someone Else May Be There While I'm Gone, one of his latest Winter Garden hits, and by Fannie Brice, the young vaudevine star, who gives her newest specialty success, "If We Could Only Take Her Word." Added to these are such genuine song-hits as "Throw Me a Rose," the waltzsong from "Miss Springtime," "Give Me All of You" from "Flora Bella," "Everybody Loves An Irish Song" and "The Lovelight In Your Eyes."

Needless to say, the six dances listed are as brilliant as Columbia dance-records usually are, and the remainder of the list as varied and interesting as any that Columbia ever announced. It was just the com. mon old game of signing the other fellow's name, or anybody's name to the check that was played in this instance, and the clerks at the Melton Dry Goods Co. store and at the Hub passed the goods over the counter, with a little cash thrown in for expense money.

A man called at the Melton store about dark Thursday night and purchased a bill of goods tendering in payment of same check drawn on the Miles National Bank for \$18, made payable to Clifford Foster and signed by Homer Harrison. The young man passing the check posed as Clift ford Foster.

While this transaction was going on another man was buying goods at the Hub, and tendered a check drawn on the Miles National Bank for \$16, made payable to Clifford Foster and signed by Homer Harrison. Both checks were written by the same party, the hand writing showing to be the same, but were passed by diferent parties.

PIONEER GITIZEN TAX COLLECTOR BURIED NEAR CREWS

The remains of I. L. Dietz were laid to rest in the Crews cemetery about noon Thursday, Dec. 28th. A wife, several children and many friends are grieving the loss of this good man.

Mr. Dietz came to Runnels coun ty many years ago, and located in the Crews country. His early days were spent in South Texas. He lived to see this county develope from a stock country, and prosperous farming country, and he did his part towards developing the country, always standing for the things that made for the petterment of humanity.

Deceased had been in poor health for some time. His condition, however, was not considered serious and he had been able to attend to his business and look af ter his work, and only a short time ago was in Ballinger. He became seriously ill Tuesday night and died about one o'clock of the same night. He will be missed in the Crews community as well as in the entire county.
