



PAT MURPHY SELLS PART SAN ANGELO STANDARD

J. G. Murphy, publisher of The Standard for the last thirty-four years and perhaps the best known newspaper man in West Texas, sold the paper Saturday to Houston Harte of Boonville, Mo.
