



soon as possible in making a gue also expresses itself as being wholesale drive against the Jack indebted to Gus Noyes, who rabbit pest in this county, was donated the use of the building in W. C. Wheelis. the general opinion expressed to which the Show was held. The Ledger today, by an interested party. Reports coming indicate that cabbits have multiplied wonderfully during the present year, and the destruction of crops next spring will be great, if the pests are not exterminated.

Neighboring counties are adopt ing the unique plan of driving the rabbits into a corral constructed of poultry wire, and in addition to making a wholesale slaughter, the plan will afford much sport to those who take Coons; 3rd, Ben Coons. part in the drive.

This plan provides for building a corral, or pen, and forming a pocket to trap the rabbits, a large number of people will meet and form in line entending out over a large territory and round the rabbits up. This plan will be inexpensive as the wire can be used for other purposes after Mr Rabait has raid the prof for his depredations. The dealers would no doubt loan the wire to the citizens for this purpose, the wire to be returned and damages paid

At the present price of shells it is expensive to shoot the rabbits. Thousands could be rounded up and slaughtered without any expense, and if there is a demand for rabbit hash the rabbits could be dressed and marketed direct from the corral where they are rounded up.

Neighboring counties are adopt ing the unique plan of driving the rabbits into a corral constructed of poultry wire, and in addition to making a wholesale slaughter, the plan will afford much sport to those wito take Coons; 3rd, Ben Coons. part in the drive.

This plan provides for building a corral, or pen, and forming a pocket to trap the rabbits, a targe number of people will meet and form in line entending out over a large territory and round the rabbits up. This plan will be inexpensive as the wire can be used for other purposes after Mr. Rabbit has read the press for his depredations. The dealers would no doubt loan the wire to the citizens for this purpose, the wire to be returned and damages paid




