DATES SET FOR ANNUAL INTERSCHOLASTIC MEET

The district interscholastic league meet will be held in San Angelo Friday and Saturday, April 15 and 16, next year, according to the terms of an agreement reached at a meeting Wednesday of the executive committee of the league, which include representatives from ten West Texas counties. F. E. Smith, superintendent of the San Angelo public schools, is the district director of the league activities and presided over the meeting, which was held at the First Presbyterian church.

The district includes beside Tom Green, Concho, Runnels, Reagan, Coke, Irion, Upton, Crockett, Schleicher and Sterling counties. The county meets, which are preliminaries to the district meet, will be held in the different counties some time in March.

The winners in the county meets will come here to the district meet and the winners in this meet will go to Austin to compete in the state meet held there the first week in May. The contests in which the children will engage include spelling, debating, declaiming, essay writing and field athletic events of various kinds.—San Angelo Standard.

CALL MEETING ON IRRIGATION AT AUSTIN

STAMFORD, Tex., Dec. 23.—A conference on irrigation for West Texas has been called for January 17 at Austin, to be presided over by J. A. Kemp, head of the irrigation committee of the West Texas Chamber of Commerce. Senator Tillotson of Sealy and J. E. Starley of Pecos will be among the speakers. Representatives from Ballinger, Abilene, Del Rio, Pecos, El Paso, Bronte, San Angelo, Wichita Falls, San Saba and other parts of West Texas interested in irrigation will be present.

At a recent conference between Governor-Elect Pat M. Neff and Porter A. Whaley, General Manager of the West Texas Chamber of Commerce, Mr. Neff expressed himself as vitally interested in the irrigation projects of the West and desirous of giving encouragement to measures in the Legislature looking to the promotion of worthy irrigation schemes. It is believed as a result of the conference at Austin a long step forward will be taken which will give the proper aid to pending irrigation projects which are being denied Federal aid for the reason that the government owns no lands in the state that would be an inducement for it to develop them, while on the other hand the state is vitally interested in the reclamation of the semi-desert land contiguous to great bodies of water which might be transferred into profitable producing lands at economical cost to the state or communities by means of state loans. These matters will be discussed thoroughly at the conference, which is expected to take on the aspect of great development for the West from an irrigation standpoint.

Among the projects which will be given particular attention are the Abilene, Bronte-Ballinger, Pecos, Fort Stockton, Wichita Falls, San Saba-Del Rio. Practically every feasible project will be given proper encouragement to the end that the state may early begin its work of reclamation along lines which will insure the rapid and profitable development of the entire West.

D'ANNUZIO IS REPORTED WOUNDED

TRIESTE, Dec. 28.—News confirming the reports that Gabriele D'Annunzio, the Italian insurgent leader at Fiume, was wounded in recent fighting between his legionnaires and General Caviglia's regulars, was received here today. The report did not give any details of the insurgent poet's wounding.

LONDON, Dec. 28.—There is reason to believe that the Fiume is occupied by regular troops, Premier Giolitti of Italy, declared at a press conference at Rome last night, says a Central News Bureau dispatch received here from that city.

ROME, Dec. 28.—The mayor of Fiume has asked General Caviglia, commander of the Italian regular forces, for a suspension of hostilities, according to Fiume dispatches received here today.

General Caviglia stipulated two conditions, one of which has already been accepted. It is expected that an interview which has been arranged for today between the mayor and General Ferrario, commander of the blockading forces, the terms of capitulation will be agreed upon.

ANGELO TO BUILD A COUNTRY CLUB
SAN ANGELO, Dec. 23.—One of the most modern and completely equipped country clubs in Texas, is to be constructed within three miles of this city, at a cost of \$25,000, the playground to be ready for occupancy by the San Angelo Country Club by July 1, 1921, according to P. A. Williams, local contractor. The grounds will include an airplane landing field, tennis court and golf links. Oared fishing craft and motor launches will be floated on the South Concho river, where bath houses will be built. The club building is of Spanish architectural design.
