



# FORGET THE THINGS BEHIND Look Forward to the Things Before.

# This is What Business Has Got to Do and is Doing:

Forget that there was a war and the reconstruction period; forget that there was profiteering, irritation, hardship and losses.

Quit holding POST MORTEMS. What's done is done and can't be undone.

A mill will never grind with the water that has passed.

Mistakes? Of course we have made mistakes. A man who never made a mistake never made anything. The successful man, the great man, is not the man who makes no mistakes, but the man who organizes victory out of mistakes.

No less an authority than Judge Gary, who, they say, controls more money than the United States Treasury, declares that there is a new day dawning in business already in the East; that the Atlantic seaboard feels the difference in the new spring of life.

Shall we, out here in the West, trail behind the East?

"Out where the world is still in the making, Where fewer hearts with despair are breaking, That's where the WEST begins."

We, who hold the gateway to the West. It is unthinkable that we, of all others, shall permit the past to overshadow us, get a grip on us and hold us down. The long night has rolled away. Now it is time to forget it—to wake up—and, with fresh and cheerful aspect, look to the future.

There are several very definite things for us to do.

### I. Get Money Out and Set it to Work

The circulating medium is like the circulation of the blood. It can congest, cause disease, decay and financial death.

The present is no time to keep money tied up in safety deposit boxes, or hidden away in trunks or bureau drawers. You can't dig down deep enough to hide your money where it will be safe. BUILD ANY OLD THING, BUT BUILD. Suppose it does cost money to do it, all the better. You set somebody to work and you get a return.

#### IV. Make a Very Definite and Determined Effort at Good Cheer

Optimism can be voluntary; cheerfulness can be cultivated. and it certainly is a stimulus to business and to the public welfare.

There is no use for a man, any more than for his money, to wear out or to rust out. It is care that killed a cat, not hard work. It is anxiety and worry that dries up the springs of life, never activity and GOOD CHEER.

# V. Go Out and Kill Somethig —GLOOM

It is not for us to be content with being cheerful ourselves; but it is for us to try to drive away the mists and the blues from around the other fellow.

Hopefulness and cheery activity are infectious and you can count on the other fellow catching it from you—but this is not enough.

Each one of us can add to production and speed up business by making a definite effort to lighten the other man's gloom.

If it takes time to do it, it is time well spent, for it will affect the atmosphere of the whole community in which you live and, therefore, of the nation.

## VI. Help the Other Fellow's Business

If one prospers, all prosper.

If one suffers, all suffer.

The social structure is like the human frame—a tooth can't ache without upsetting the whole physical being.

The welfare of each one is the welfare of all. We are tied together with invisible, but universal bonds.

It is as true today as it was in the day of Ben Franklin that we must all hang together, or hang searately.

CO-OPERATION, then is essential.

Talk up the other fellow's business and don't knock. Whether he is a competitor or not, he is a member of society and so are you. You are both in the same boat.

If we all pull together with a heavy pull and a long, strong one, the business boat will go forging ahead and the race will be won.





# **NEGRO AND STILL** TAKEN IN RAID


A light colored gentleman is in the Ballinger jail, and Sheriff Jim Flynt has in his possession about four gallons of home-made booze, and Federal officers are coming here to take charge of the colored gentleman and handle him according to the law governing Joonshining.

Sheriff Flynt raided a farm house in the Dry Ridge community Monday, where the negro was living, and where it was suspected that home-brew was brewing. The officer's suspicion was verified by the discovery of two barrels of mash and a common galvanized oil can almost full of the fiery liquor.

A negro woman and a negro boy were at the house, and the woman started the boy to the field where the negro man was at work to put him next to what was about to take place, but the sheriff proved the best sprinter and beat the boy to the field and arrested the negro man.

The negro told the officer that "nobody cepts us knows anything bout dis," and he requested the officer to keep it on the quiet.


