### "GHEE" MUCH USED IN EAST

Concentrated Form of Butter Fat Employed in Preparation of Almost All Dishes.

Ghee is briefly described as clariand boiling which yields a concentrated form of butter fat considered to be entirely free from curd, whey or water. This product keeps better than ordinary butter, but has a taste not usually appreciated by Europeans. Although commonly associated with the diet of the British Indian, ghee is used as well throughout the Red sea district by the Arabs, Somalis, British Indians, and other native elements of the population. In a minor way ghee is used medicinally and ceremonially; but its principal use is in the preparation of food, and no native meal in this part of the world is truly relished unless ghee is generously used in some form or other. It is worked into the dough for native bread, and the bread is fried in ghee; or if ordinary bread is used the pieces broken off to be eaten are first dipped into a cup or preparation of all meat dishes, and of particularly the Arabs, boil it with alk and drink the mixture.
