Engineer Killed Near Abilene In Explosion

Robbers Blow Up Train In Effort to Get Money

of Big Spring, Texas, is dead and Fireman J. C. Jennings and Brakeman E. B. Atwell, were seriously injured as the result of an explosion of one of the largest locomotives on this division of the Texas & Pacific Railroad, 10 miles East of Abilene this morning.

Engineer Edwards only lived forty minutes after the explosion. The cab of the locomitive was blown one thousand feet from the boiler. The train was running when the blow-up occurred and no cause for the explosion has been learned.

Foreign Powers Accept U. S. Naval Disarmament Proposal

WASHINGTON, Nov. 15 .- In unison, Great Britain, France, Italy and Japan, today accepted in spirit and principle the proposals of the United States, made through Secretary of State Charles E. Hughes, for a ten year naval holiday and the junketing of more than sixty battleships. The nations only made reservations for suggesting modifications of detail in working out the proposed plans. The unanimous acceptance adds to American history a new anniversary, which will be observed by generations to come.

In the following order forme: Premier Arthur J. Balfour, peaking for Great Britain; Baron Admiral Kato, speaking for Japan; Senator Schanzer, speaking for Italy; and Premier Aristide Briand, speaking for France; rose in praising in the highest terms the plans of the program suggested by the American govmment and gave adherence of their governments to the general terms of the proposals.

Secretary Hughes thanked the representatives of the foreign powers for their cordial expressions and declared that the time had come to proceed with the considerations of the details of the agreement. 





YOUNG MAN KILLED AT WINTERS BY SPENT SI

WINTERS, Nov. 11.—An American Legion celebration here last night cost the life of Luther Yeager, age 26, son of County Commissioner D. W. Yeager. Yeager was shot down, presumably by a stray bullet, about one o'clock as he was standing on the sidewalk in front of the Watkin's Candy Kitchen, and died in the arms of his younger brother without speaking a word...

The bullet penetrated the head just below the left eye, ranging upward and lodged in the back of the head. When extracted the bu llet was declared to be from a .38 calibre pis-

The death of young Yeager concluded a wild west celebration of the worst type, in which it is declared that pistols, shot-guns, fire crackers, anvils and dynamite were used. It is estimated that at least one hundred guns were used and at least one thousand shots were fired. Bullet holes in awnings and gun wadding and shells scattered over the streets indicated that pistols and shot-guns were fired freely and in the most reckless manner in the business district.




