

Experts claim that the possibility of persons having the prints of their fore-fingers precisely alike, is only one in 50,000,000. The same percentage holds good for the thumb prints and those of the other fingers; so the possibility of two persons having exactly the same prints of three fingers would stretch almost into the bounds of infinity. Barring a wound or other accident which causes a scar, finger prints never vary from cradle
