U. S. Highway From Cisco To Abilene Underway

Autoists may now get an idea how the super-duper U. S. Highway 80 will appear when re-routed and completed between Cisco and Abilene.

Right-of-way has been cleared the entire distance. All grading has been finished between Baird and Clyde and much from Clyde to Abilene. Some traffic moves to between Baird and Clyde over the wide, new stretch, but the roadway itself has not been officially thrown open. Several weeks will elapse before seal coating is placed.

The 50 miles of new super highway between Cisco and Abilene will be among the best in the Southwest. None of the presently used route will be utilized in the new system, it was reported.

A JOINT RESOLUTION

proposing an amendment to Section 28 of Article III of the Constitution of the State of Texas, to be provided for and as follows:

SECTION 28. The Legislature shall, at its first regular session after the adjournment of the United States decennial census, apportion the state into senatorial and representative districts, accessible to the provisions of Sections 25, 26, and 26a of this Article. If the Legislature shall at any such first regular session following the publication of the United States decennial census fail to make such apportionment, same shall be made by the Legislative Redistricting Board of Texas, which is hereby created, and shall be composed of five (5) members, as follows: The Lieutenant Governor, the Speaker of the House of Representatives, the Attorney General, the Comptroller of Public Accounts and a majority of whom shall constitute a quorum.

Said Board shall assemble in the City of Austin within ninety (90) days after the final adjournment of such regular session. The Board shall, within sixty (60) days after the adjournment, apportion the state into senatorial and representative districts, or into senatorial and representative districts, as the failure of either of such Legislatures may make necessary. Such apportionment shall be in writing and signed by three (3) or more of the members of the Board duly acknowledged as such and filed with the Secretary of State, and shall have force and effect when the next succeeding Court of Texas shall have jurisdiction to compel such Commission to perform its duties in accordance with the provisions of this section as hereinafter provided.

Section 25. The Legislature shall provide the necessary funds for clerical and travel expenses during the term of the work of the Board, and the Lieutenant Governor and the Speaker of the House of Representatives shall be entitled to receive per diem and travel expenses during the term of the Board, and the amount of such allowance shall be determined by the Legislature. This amendment shall become effective January 1, 1951.

Section 26. The foregoing constitutional amendment shall be submitted to a vote of the qualified electors of this state at an election to be held throughout the state on the first Tuesday after the first Monday in November, A. D. 1948, at which all ballots shall have the printed thereon:

"FOR the amendment to Section 25, Article III of the Constitution of Texas providing for a Board for apportionment of the state into senatorial districts and representative districts in the event the Legislature fails to make such apportionment."

Each voter at such election shall mark out one of such choices on the ballot, leaving the space expressing his vote on the proposed amendment.

Section 26a. The Governor of the State of Texas shall have the necessary proclamation for said election, and shall have the same published as required by the Constitution and laws of this state. §

Sec. 2. The sum of Ten Thousand (\$10,000.00) Dollars or so much thereof as may be necessary, is hereby appropriated out of any funds in the treasury of this state not otherwise appropriated, to pay the expense of such publication and election.
